

C: Amen.

P: We learn that we are sinners from God's Law. As we read it, we see that we cannot possibly live up to it. Therefore, on this day of repentance and sorrow, as we begin our Lenten journey to the cross of Christ, impressing upon ourselves His bitter suffering and death, we recite together the Ten Commandments and their meanings.

P: Having now reviewed the Law of God which we transgress every day, let us then confess our sins to God our Father.

ALL: O almighty God, merciful Father, I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess unto You all my sins and iniquities, with which I have ever offended You, and justly deserve Your temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them, and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy, and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death, of Your Beloved Son Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor sinful being.

P: Upon this your confession, I by virtue of my office as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the Grace of God to all of you. And in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.
