About the cover art: The picture on the bulletin cover today is what is called a "woodcut", a form of art from the middle ages. The carver is Hans Brosamer, an old German engraver who lived at nearly the same time as Luther in the 16th Century. This picture was found as a carving to introduce the "Sacrament of Baptism" in a printing of Luther's Catechism, 1550 Frankfurt edition. It pictures Christ being baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River.
