Ordnung des Hauptgottesdienstes

(Order of the Divine Service) Setting Five, LSB p. 213 ff.

One of the concerns raised during the time of the Reformation was for people to be able to participate in the worship service in their own language (in their case, German). Until that time, the music and much of the speaking was all in Latin. Early in the 1520s, the people were asking Martin Luther to revise the Latin Mass (Communion service) by simply translating it into German. Luther, however, being a good musician in his own right, was concerned that the music of the Latin Mass was specially fitted to the Latin words, and that simply translating the words into German just wouldn't do. He said, "I cannot bear to hang German words on Latin notes." Yet the calls for a Communion Service in the German Language continued, and so, in 1526, Luther assembled a series of hymns, written mostly by him, as a service called the "Deutsche Messe" (German Mass, or German Communion Service). New German hymns were written to replace the major parts of the Latin Service.

Today's service uses many of these hymns (translated for us into English), with one exception. The "Kyrie" (Lord, have mercy) hymn (LSB 942) is difficult to sing. Instead, we will sing an original hymn by Pastor McPike written to fit Luther's Lord's Prayer hymn tune.



The hymn Martin Luther wrote for the Creed is somewhat difficult to sing; thus, it is sung as a solo, together with the words of the Nicene Creed spoken by the congregation, as follows:

C: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.
