C: Amen.

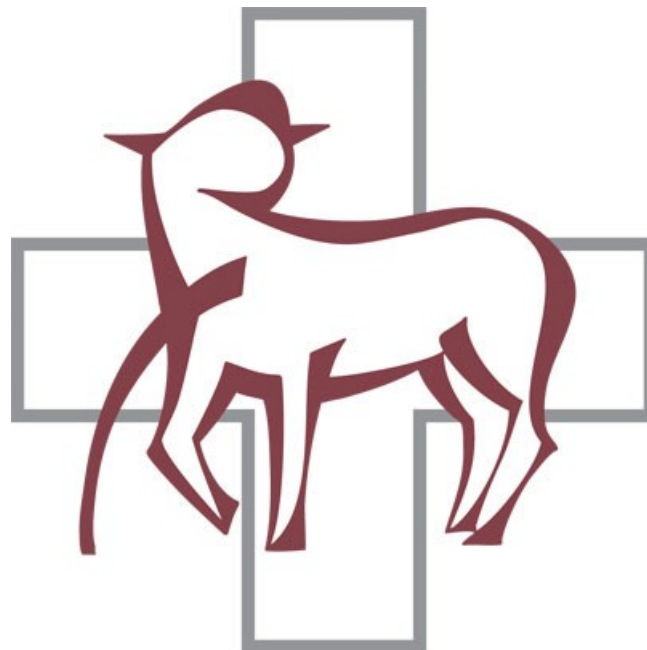

- P: In many and various ways, God spoke to His people of old by the prophets.
C: **But now in these last days, He has spoken to us by His Son.**

Litany

(after each petition congregation responds with Lord, have mercy)

- L: For the faithful who have gone before us and are with Christ let us give thanks to the Lord.
C: **Thanks be to God!**
L: Help, save, comfort and defend us, gracious Lord.
(Silence for meditation)

- L: Rejoicing in the fellowship of all the saints, let us commend ourselves, one another, and our whole life to Christ, our Lord.
C: **To You, O Lord!**

- L: O God, from who come all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works, give to us, Your servants, that peace which the world cannot give, that our hearts may be set to obey Your commandments, and also that we, being defended from the fear of our enemies, may live in peace and quietness; through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Savior, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
C: **Amen.**
L: Lord, remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray:
C: **Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name...**
L: Let us bless the Lord.
C: **Thanks be to God.**
