

Holy Gospel: Luke 2:1-14

(sung responsively to the tune "O Little Town of Bethlehem", TLH 647)

- P: And now the Holy Gospel, is read for you to hear,
- C: Our praise and thanks we offer, to God alone, most dear.
- P: For in the second chapter, St. Luke of Jesus wrote,
- C: Our voices now we lift and sing, "Glory to You, O Lord."

P: And it came to pass, in those days, there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be taxed. (And this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.) And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:) To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child. And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn. And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid. And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord. And this shall be a sign unto you; Ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying:

(At this point, the congregation sings, to the tune of "Hark, the Herald Angels Sing":)

Glory be to God on high Peace on earth, to all is nigh.

Angels to the shepherds sing, Telling of the newborn King.

Peace on earth from sins forgiv'n, telling of our place in heaven.

Now we hear the angel hymn: "Christ is born, in Bethlehem!"

Glory be to God on high, Peace on earth to all is nigh!

(following the stanza, the pastor continues the Gospel:)

P: And it came to pass, as the Angels were gone away from them And it came to pass, as the angels were gone away from them into heaven, the shepherds said one to another, Let us now go even unto Bethlehem, and see this thing which is come to pass, which the Lord hath made known unto us. And they came with haste, and found Mary, and Joseph, and the babe lying in a manger. And when they had seen it, they made known abroad the saying which was told them concerning this child. And all they that heard it wondered at those things which were told them by the shepherds. But Mary kept all these things, and pondered

them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them.
