Hymn, "Happy the Man Who Feareth God" Choir

Some of Martin Luther's earliest hymns are paraphrases of Psalms. "Happy the Man Who Feareth God," which was published in 1524, is a paraphrase of Psalm 128. It should come as no surprise that Luther chose to write a hymn based on this Psalm since the text praises marriage as a divine institution, an idea that stands in contrast to the pre-Reformation idealization of celibacy. Martin Luther married Katharina von Bora on June 13, 1525, the year after this hymn was published.
