P: When we eat this bread and drink this cup:

C: We proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

P: Therefore, Lord, our God, we commemorate that Christ had to suffer and die, but most of all that He is the firstborn of the dead, the firstborn of the whole creation; that glorified at Your right hand, He speaks on our behalf; and that He will come to judge the living and the dead on the day which You have appointed. We pray that we may surrender ourselves completely to Your service, and that, in the midst of this world, and before the eyes of all Your people, we may live Your Gospel and be the sign of Your peace; that we may support and serve each other in love; that our hearts may be opened to the poor, the sick, and the dying, and to all who are in need, so that we may be the Church of Jesus Christ, united with all faithful people everywhere. Through Him and with Him and in Him You are blessed and praised, Lord our God, almighty Father, in union with the Holy Spirit, today and into eternity.
