

We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20; 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should register with the pastor in his office BEFORE the service begins.

Food for Thought

I was in the grocery store check out line before Memorial Day. There was a young women paying for her groceries and having some sort of problem with her card. The man in front of me just rolled his eyes. The women was obviously pregnant and told she couldn't buy hot food with her card. She politely pushed the rotisserie chicken back towards the cashier. Do we roll our eyes also? Do we look at our carts and think how we take for granted our blessings?

On a garden walk one year, a woman had a small garden by the road telling people to take what they needed. She had the plants labeled and pictures/ descriptions of what the produce looked like ripe. Community gardens have been successful in getting neighborhoods engaged in growing fresh produce for their families. People tend to eat more fruits and vegetables if they readily available.

What can we do as individuals and as a congregation? Most vegetables plants come in four packs. Many of us like different varieties of the same vegetable. Take one plant from each pack or part of a row to donate to a family with young children or a senior person. How about planting extra green beans, potatoes, or sweet corn. You could plant a salsa or salad garden. Take your neglected old flowerbed or a weedy spot and turn into a donation garden. You choose or if you want help in distribution please call. If you are interested or maybe you already donate, I would like to hear from you.

So as we plant our gardens and dream about the harvest let us also think of ways to help low-income families get fresh fruits and vegetables.

I am only one, but still I am one. I cannot do everything, but still I can do something; and because I cannot do everything, I will not refuse to do something that I can do.
