

#### **Additional Announcements**

A big thanks to our small-but-mighty Osman choir for their service this year! We sang some of our old favorites and we learned and sang several of Martin Luther's less familiar hymns to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. We also brought joy to our shut-ins with our singing. Practices will resume again in September when we'll finish out our Reformation Year and see what the 2017-2018 has to bring.

**Food Safety:** As we celebrate this Independence Day, lets keep our friends and families safe from food poisoning. If you're like my family, we graze all day and push the limits on leaving food out on the picnic table. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention you should:

- 1. Clean hands and surfaces often. Wash your hands with soap and water. Have hand sanitizer on each picnic table. Wipe surfaces with clean cloth, dish soap and water or disposable kitchen wipes. Cooking and cutting utensils will need rinsed if washed or wipes used.
- **2. Separate**. Don't cross-contaminate. Raw meat, poultry, and seafood can spread illness-causing bacteria to already prepared foods unless you keep them separate. Don't store them in the same cooler. Don't reuse marinade that had raw meat in it.
- **3.** Cook at the right temperature. Bacteria that causes food poisoning multiplies quickest between 40 degrees and 140 degrees Fahrenheit. The safest way to tell if a food is done is with a food thermometer. Keep food hot after cooking. Wrap well and place in insulated container. Take-out food such as fried chicken should be eaten within 2 hours of purchase.
- **4. Refrigerate** promptly. Bacteria can grow in many foods within 2 hours, 1 hour if 90 degree heat. Keep perishable foods in a bowl of ice while on picnic table. Refill ice as needed. Cold freezer packs may also be used. Return to insulated cooler within recommended time.

Have good food, drink, and fellowship.
