



Welcome in Jesus' Name

Lutherans believe that Jesus Christ is present in the Sacrament so that we receive His true body and blood along with the bread and wine (Mark 14:22, 24; 1 Corinthians 10:16). We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20; 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should register with the pastor in his office BEFORE the service begins.

Well-being With Nature

My sister took me to a horticultural therapy conference in Bloomington. So what is horticultural therapy? I learned immediately after the introductions and our first project of the day. Our instructions were nonexistent. The speaker held up a coffee mug with plastic smiley face and flower in it. Told us to make an arrangement. The 3 tables set up didn't have any organization of materials and not enough tools. It was very crowded so we talked until the tables thinned out some. Since I had never worked with florist green stuff that holds flowers in place, I was asking a lot of questions. People around me were very helpful or in the same boat as me. Then the instructor started announcing, ten minutes to go and so on. So stressful. I thought this was going to be a fun conference! Everyone had different arrangements of sizes and shapes. You could tell the ones that had taken flower arrangement class and those of us who hadn't. The learning point was that the process is more important than the end result. We socialized, shared tools and ideas, laughed, physically moved around, and focused on the task. Horticultural therapy is the process of gardening as a tool to help an individual achieve well-being. Well-being may be intellectual, physical, emotional, social, or spiritual.

I tried this lesson with my granddaughters making seed "cookies". I gave them instructions with a mock demonstration. They had to measure and mix the water with clay. Then roll out the clay and press in seeds. Next they cut with cookie cutters and transferred to a cookie sheet to dry. The cookies weren't perfect but it's the process, not the end product.
