

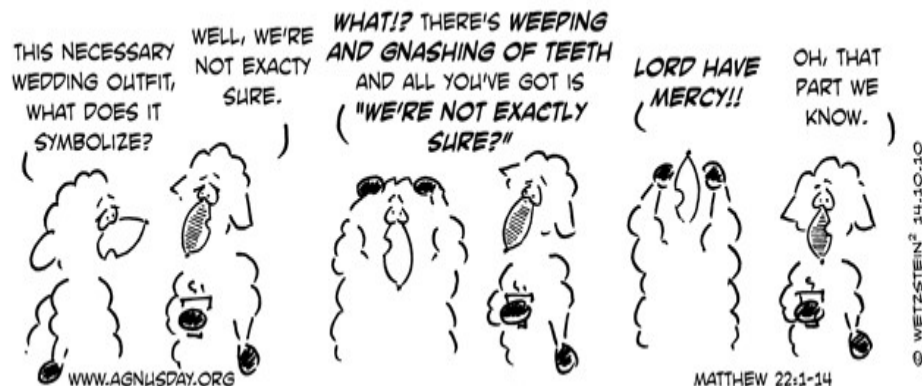

October Brings More Than Trick Or Treat: There's something scarier than Halloween ghosts and that's influenza. How can you protect yourself and loved ones? You might say "I never get the flu, why do I need a shot?" or "The shot gives me the flu so I don't get one." Let's look at the facts and answer these good questions. Flu season is usually late fall to early spring. The Center for Disease control recommends all persons aged 6 months and greater who do not have contraindications get the flu vaccine. Pregnant women may receive any of the licensed vaccines. Getting the vaccine by the end of October is best but it's never too late. You are not only protecting yourself but the people around you from getting the flu. Some unvaccinated people have no symptoms or very mild flu symptoms that last a few days but may pass it to persons who develop life-threatening symptoms. Older people, young children, and people with certain health conditions are at high risk of serious flu complications. The vaccine will not give you the flu. It takes at least 3 weeks to develop enough antibodies to protect against the flu. If you do get the flu the symptoms will be less severe.

Get the flu shot.

Cover your coughs and sneezes.

Wash your hands frequently.

Stay home if you are ill. You may be able to pass the flu virus 1-4 days before symptoms start and 5-7 days longer after the symptoms start.

Children may remain infectious longer.

Avoid shaking hands during flu season. Greet with a smile and nod or bow. Be creative in what to do with your hands.

Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs like the flu.

Take the flu antiviral drug if your provider prescribes them.

Help our community make the flu season safer for all.
