



The Great American SmokeOut: The American Cancer Society has dedicated November 16th as the Great American SmokeOut. The goal is to educate, give tools and support for people who use tobacco to quit. There is no one right way to stop smoking or chewing but a few steps may make it more successful. The first step is to decide to quit. Think about why you want to guit and write them down. Look at them every time you want to use tobacco. Set a date to quit. Pick a day within the next month and mark it. Don't make it too far in the future but allow yourself time to prepare. Make a plan to quit. There are many ways to quit, some work better than others. Nicotine replacement therapy, and prescription drugs have been shown to improve the success rate of quitting. Talk with your provider or dentist about these options. Other methods such as cold turkey or gradual withdrawal have worked for some. Filters, diets, tobacco lozenges, herbs and supplements have not been shown to work or are even safe. Electronic cigarettes are not safer than cigarettes and should not be used to quit smoking. There is no safe form of tobacco. Support should be a key part of your plan. All 50 states have some type of free telephone-based program with smoking cessation counselors. The Illinois Tobacco Quitline is # 866-QUIT-YES (866-784-8937). There are web-based quit programs, cellphone apps and local support groups to help with smoking cessation. Ask your family and friends to help. DeWitt-Piatt Bi-County Health Department in Monticello no longer offers tobacco cessation. You are referred to Illinois Quitline above. Champaign Urbana Public Health District, Champaign phone 217-352-7961. Not heard back from them about their program. Quitline is option. McLean County Health, Promotion Division, Bloomington phone 309-888-5446. Tobacco cessation support not available at this time. Referred to Quitline above. There may seem like obstacles too great to overcome, but your savior and congregation is here to help one day at a time. Pick up a pledge card by bulletin board.
