

Colorectal Cancer Fact Sheet

Are you at risk?

- People age 50 and older
- People who smoke
- People who are overweight or obese
- People who are physically inactive
- People who drink alcohol in excess
- People who eat a lot of red or processed meat
- People with a personal or family histories of colorectal cancer or noncancerous polyps
- People with a personal history of an inflammatory bowel disease
- People with family history of inherited colorectal cancers

How do you reduce your risk?

- Be physically active for at least 30 minutes 5 days a week.
- Maintain a healthy weight.

- Don't smoke.
- If you drink alcohol, have no more than 1 drink per day for a woman, 2 for a man.
- Eat fruits, vegetables, and whole grains to stay healthy.
- Eat less red and processed meats.

If you are at average risk, start getting screened at age 50, sooner if at higher risk. If you are older than 75, ask your provider about continued screening. The best time to get screened is before you have symptoms.

What are the symptoms?

- Bleeding from the rectum or blood in the stool
- Change in bowel habits
- General problems in the abdomen, such as bloating, fullness, cramps
- Diarrhea, constipation
- Unexplained weight loss
- Being tired all the time
- Vomiting

How is screening done?

- Colonoscopy every 10 years
- Virtual colonoscopy every 5 years
- Flexible sigmoidoscopy every 5 years
- Double-contrast barium enema every 5 years

Tests that mainly find cancer

- Stool occult blood, stool immunochemical test may be done yearly.
- Stool DNA, ask your provider about this evolving test.
