

Service Notes: Paraments are white, the color of purity. White reminds us of the holiness of the Risen Christ, who defeated sin for us. Through Baptism, that holiness is given us as a gift. The Paschal Candle stands next to the pulpit during this Easter Season. Lighting it before we arrive and extinguishing it after we leave symbolizes the on-going presence of the Risen Christ with His disciples in the 40 days between Easter Sunday and Ascension Day.

Preventing Falls

Falls are the main cause of injury and disability in older adults. Hip fractures are especially serious fall injuries. A number of things increase your risk of falling. Your vision and hearing probably are not as sharp as they once were, so you may miss cues that would help you avoid objects that could trip you. Some health problems can affect your strength and balance. Some medicines may make you drowsy or dizzy and more likely to fall. Accidents do happen, but there are some things you can do to reduce your risk of falling.

Make Your Home Safer

- Remove or fix things that you could trip over, such as raised doorway thresholds, throw rugs, or loose carpet.
- Keep paths clear of electrical cords and clutter.
- Use nonskid floor wax and wipe up spills right away.
- Keep your house well lit, especially stairways, porches, and outside walkways.
- Put night lights in bedroom, bathroom, and hall.
- Add extra light switches or use remote switches, such as "the clapper"
- Put sturdy handrails on stairways.
- Have sidewalks and steps shoveled and salted or sanded in winter.

Bathroom Safety

- Install grab handles inside and outside your shower or tub and near the toilet and sink.
- Use nonskid mats.
- Use a shower chair or bath bench.
- Try using a handheld showerhead to help with bathing.

Be Careful

- Wear low-healed shoes with nonskid soles.
- Do not wear socks without shoes on smooth floors.
- Store things on lower shelves so that you don't have to climb or reach high.
- Always use the handrail when you go up and down the stairs.
- Do not try to carry too many things at the same time.
- Use a walker or can with nonslip rubber tips.

Take Care of Yourself

- Get regular exercise to improve your strength, muscle tone, and balance.
- Have your vision and hearing checked each year.
- Know the side effects of the medicines you take.
- Stand up slowly after you have been sitting or lying.
- Limit how much alcohol you drink.
