



Announcements

Service Notes: This Sunday is unique as a Sunday of the Church Year. All other Sundays relate in one way or another to an occasion, while this Sunday came about primarily because of a specific teaching. The teaching about or doctrine of the Trinity is difficult. It is a mystery that we can never fully understand. What we can know is what the Bible tells us, and we are called to believe it despite our inability to understand. The Old Testament Lesson is Isaiah's vision of the throne room of heaven. The simple reality in the all of Isaiah is that, as we face the holiness of God, we are ruined, as we see how sin causes ruin in our lives and everything about us. The Acts reading recalls God's gracious plan of Salvation. St. John in the Gospel reports the conversation between Jesus and the Pharisee Nicodemus, a very clear statement about Baptism and the work of the Spirit. The three persons of the Trinity are clearly identified: God the Father, who loves the world, sent His Son, Jesus, with whom Nicodemus was conversing, Who saved the world from sin and sends the Holy Spirit to breath ethe breath of God into our lives as we receive the waters of Baptism. Paraments are white, the color of holiness. White reminds us of the holiness of our great God.

Thanks to our small but mighty Osman choir for another great year! Thank you for your hard work and dedication to praising God through song. Thank you for your willingness to spread Christmas and Easter cheer to our shut-in members. You're the best! Have a blessed summer, and I look forward to resuming practice in the fall!
