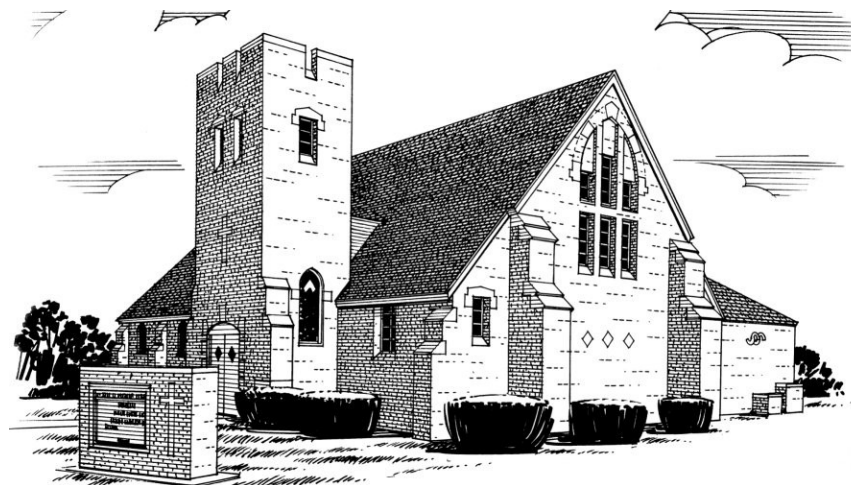

Service Notes: The trouble that is in this world can be traced directly back to the days immediately following creation. The reporting of the creation of the world is structured in such a way to emphasize that God made a perfect creation. The perfection was soon destroyed, however, by the enemy of God, Satan. The work of Satan to destroy creation ties today's Old Testament to today's Gospel. The Old Testament Lesson is the report of the fall of Adam and Eve into sin, as well as the first promise of the savior. The Gospel shows those opposed to Jesus attempting to accuse Him of being at least possessed by a demon if not the devil himself. Jesus counters by the stern warning of the only unforgivable sin, and that is the sin against the Holy Spirit. Because the Spirit works through the Means of Grace to bring people to faith by bringing us forgiveness, keeps us in faith and empowers us to live as God's people, shutting off the power coming from God's Holy Spirit is no less than self-condemnation to eternity without God. Jesus' warning in this Gospel indicates the blasphemy of those opposed to Him and the dire consequences of remaining therein. Paraments are green, the color of life in nature. As green dominates nature to show the life of lifeless looking plants in the spring, so doing good works for God allows our faith to show itself by what we do.
