



Welcome in Jesus' Name

Lutherans believe that Jesus Christ is present in the Sacrament so that we receive His true body and blood along with the bread and wine (Mark 14:22, 24; 1 Corinthians 10:16). We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20; 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should register with the pastor in his office BEFORE the service begins.

Announcements - 1

Service Notes: During this time after Pentecost, when the color of the altar paraments is green, the church focuses on growth. The first or *festival half* of the church year is more focused on the works of Jesus; now, we focus on the teachings of Jesus and how they play out in our lives as we grow as Christians. Today's lessons focus on how the Kingdom of God grows, as His people grow in connection to His word and sacraments. The *Old Testament Reading* is a prophecy from Ezekiel about God planting a sprig on the mountain of Israel, pointing to the Messiah, who will grow from the house of David. In the *Gospel*, Jesus explains the kingdom of God using parables about planting the smallest of seeds that grows into a large plant and about growth happening without our even knowing how. All of these Lessons point to God, who plants his kingdom and causes faith in Jesus to grow. *(adapted from Concordia Pulpit Resources, 25.3, 2015)*. Green continues as the color of the paraments, reminding us that just as green indicates growth in nature, so we are reminded of our growth as Christians through connection to God's word and sacraments.
