

Announcements

Service Notes: Today's worship connects thematically with last week as those opposed to God not only reject the message of God, but messengers who bring God's word. Last week's Old Testament Lesson was part of Ezekiel's call, where God identifies that success in His mind is not positive outcomes often sought, but in faithfulness to preaching the message. This week's Old Testament is God's message through Amos, the opposition of the King of Israel, and Amos' response that God had called him from farming to preaching. (This text was chosen by Pastor Peters for his funeral over 9 years ago). Last week, the Gospel reported the rejection of Jesus. This week's Gospel reports the circumstances of the death of John the Baptist, who was executed by King Herod because of God's word. The Epistle would seek to lift our eyes from this tension of the opposition to God and God's people to the inheritance that we have in heaven. Paraments are green, the color of life in nature. Green reminds us of life that God gives through the indwelling of the Spirit, and the works we do as a result show that life to those around us.
