

Welcome in Jesus' Name

Lutherans believe that Jesus Christ is present in the Sacrament so that we receive His true body and blood along with the bread and wine (Mark 14:22, 24; 1 Corinthians 10:16). We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20: 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should register with the pastor in his office BEFORE the service begins.

Head and Neck Cancers

Cancers of the head and neck include cancers that start in the head and throat excluding cancers of the brain and eyes. These cancers can start-

- In the sinuses, inside and behind the nose.
- In the mouth, including the tongue, gums, and roof of the mouth
- In the back of the mouth and the throat (pharynx)
- In the larynx (voice box)
- On the lips (skin cancer)
- In the salivary glands, which is rare

What Causes Head and Neck Cancers?

Alcohol and tobacco are major risk factors for cancers of the head and neck. All tobacco cancers including cigarettes, cigars, pipes, and smokeless tobacco (chewing, snuff or a type of chewing tobacco called betel quid) are linked to head and neck cancers. Drinking any type of alcohol, also raises the risk of getting cancers of the mouth, throat and voice box. About 70% of cancers of the oropharynx (which include the tonsils, soft palate, and base of the tongue) are linked to human papillomavirus (HPV), a common sexually transmitted virus. Occupational exposures can increase the risk of head and neck cancers. Exposure to chemicals, such as used in textile, ceramic, logging, and food processing, can increase a persons risk. Radiation treatments to the head and neck can increase one's risk. The mononucleosis virus, Epstein-Barr, can increase the risk of salivary gland cancers. About twice as many men as women get head and neck cancers.

What are the Symptoms of Head and Neck Cancers?

In the mouth, cancer can cause-

- A white or red sore that does not heal on the gums, tongue, or lining of the mouth
- Swelling in the jaw
- Unusual pain or bleeding in the mouth
- A lump or thickening
- Problem with dentures

At the back of the mouth cancer can cause-

- Trouble breathing or speaking. A lump or thickening
- Trouble chewing or swallowing food and a feeling of something caught in the throat
- Pain in the throat that won't go away
- Pain or ringing in the ears or trouble hearing

In the voice box cancer can cause-

- Pain when swallowing
- Ear pain

In the sinuses and nasal cavity, cancer can cause-

- Blocked sinuses and infections that don't respond to treatments by provider.
- Headaches, pain and swelling around eyes, teeth or dentures. Nose bleeds.

How Can I Reduce the Risk of Head and Neck Cancers?

- Don't smoke. If you smoke, quit.
- Don't use smokeless tobacco products.
- Limit the amount of alcohol you drink.
- Discuss with your provider about the HPV vaccine if you are age 45 years and younger
- Use condoms and dental dams consistently during oral sex.
- Use sunscreen lip balm and wide-brimmed hat outdoors. Avoid indoor tanning.
- Visit the dentist regularly.
