



# Allergies, Part 1

Most allergies are caused by pollen, dust, and other things in the air. You can often find the cause of an allergy by noting when symptoms occur:

- Symptoms that happen at the same time each year are often caused by mold spores or by tree, grass, or weed pollen. You are most likely to have problems during spring, early summer, or early fall.
- Allergies that last all year may be caused by dust, dust mites, cockroaches, different kinds of mold, or animal dander.
- An animal allergy is often easy to spot. Your symptoms clear up when you stay away from the pet or its bedding.

Allergies to pollen often cause hay fever. You already know the symptoms: itchy watery eyes, sneezing, runny, stuffy, or itchy nose and fatigue. You may get dark circles under your eyes.

# Home treatment

Decongestants and antihistamines may help with some allergies. Talk with your provider on what is best for you. Read the medicine label. They may not be safe for people with certain medical conditions or with other medications. Avoid the allergen whenever possible.

#### For seasonal symptoms caused by pollen or mold spores.

- Avoid outdoor work that stirs up mold and pollen. If you must be outdoors working, wear a mask and take an antihistamine before starting. Remember to check the label. Shower and change clothes when done.
- Keep your house and car windows closed. Do not open your bedroom windows at night.
- Limit the time you spend outside when pollen counts are high.
- Wash dogs and other pets often, or leave them outside. They can bring lots of pollen into your house.

#### For year-round symptoms caused by dust or dust mites:

- Keep your bedroom and places you spend a lot of time as dust free as possible. Remove dust collectors such as wall hangings, knickknacks, and artificial flowers.
- Dust and vacuum 1-2 times a week. Consider wearing a mask. Damp mop tile, wood, or stone floors.
- Try not to use carpets, upholstered furniture, and heavy drapes. Vacuum cleaners don't pick up dust mites. Use leather, vinyl, or plastic furniture that you can wipe clean and small rugs that can be washed.
- Cover your mattress, pillow, and box spring with dust proof cases, and wipe them clean weekly. Wash bedding in hot water once a week.
- Use an air conditioner so windows can be kept closed.
- Use an air purifier with a High Efficiency Particulate Air (HEPA) filter. Consider renting one to see if it helps.

Change or clean heating and cooling system filters often.

To continue next week with other allergies, treatments and warning signs with symptoms.

Remember to cough and sneeze in the bend of your elbow or into your sleeve or shirt if no tissue. Wash hands or use sanitizer often. As Pastor McPike summed up: a person with allergies is not contagious but sanitary practice is still important for other reasons.
