

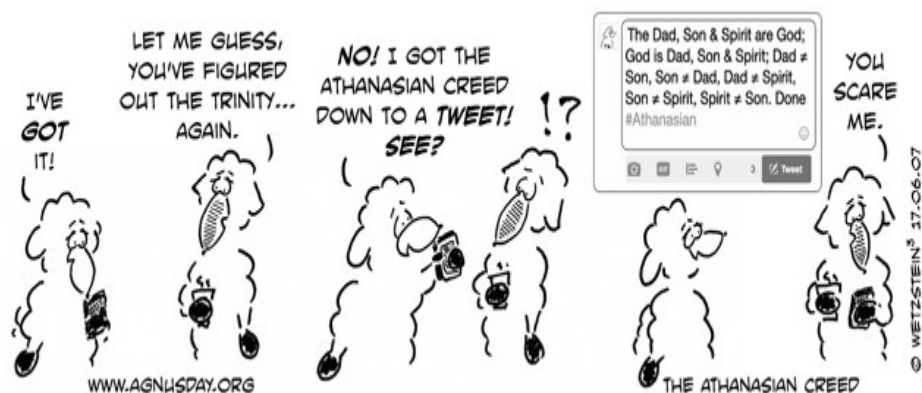

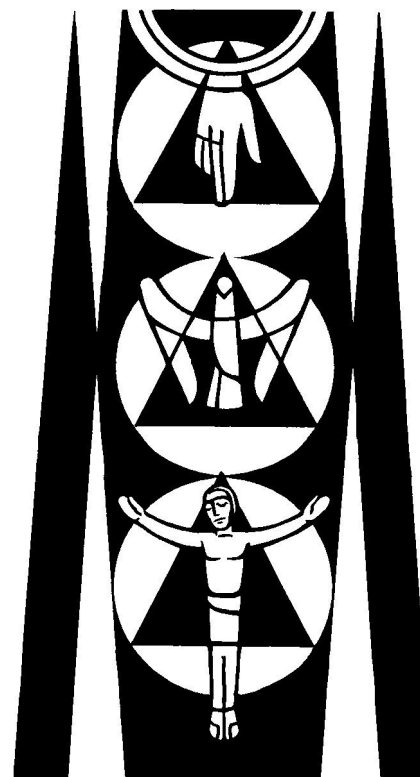

Welcome in Jesus' Name

Lutherans believe that Jesus Christ is present in the Sacrament so that we receive His true body and blood along with the bread and wine (Mark 14:22, 24; 1 Corinthians 10:16). We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20; 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should register with the pastor in his office BEFORE the service begins.

Take Steps to Avoid Injury or Death While Walking

We rarely are more vulnerable than when walking in urban areas. We are all pedestrians from time to time, so it's important to pay attention to our surroundings. According to Injury Facts from National Safety Council, in 2017, more than 16% of all traffic deaths were pedestrians. All ages are vulnerable, though 10-14-year-olds and 50-69-year-olds have 20% or more pedestrian deaths as a percentage of all traffic fatalities. Follow these safety tips as a pedestrian.

- Whenever possible, walk on the sidewalk; if none available, walk facing traffic.
- Follow the rules of the road, obeying all traffic signs and signals.
- Cross streets at crosswalks.
- If no crosswalk and your view is blocked, move to a place where you can see oncoming traffic.
- Look left, right and left again before crossing. Make eye contact with drivers of oncoming traffic to make sure they see you.
- Stay alert - avoid cell phone use and wearing earbuds.
- Avoid alcohol and drug impairment when walking.
- Wear bright or reflective clothing and use a flashlight at night.
- Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways or backing up in parking lots.
- Children under 10 should cross the street with an adult.

Heads Up, Phones Down

Everyone who has a cell phone is at risk. Distracted walking incidents are on the rise. We are losing focus on our surroundings and putting our safety at risk. The solution: Stop using phones while walking, and not just at intersections or crosswalks. Over half of related walking injuries occur in our own homes.

Pedestrian Safety Is a Shared Responsibility

When driving, help keep pedestrians of all ages safe:

- Obey all traffic laws, especially posted speed limits in school zones.
- Watch for pedestrians at all times and be extra cautious when backing up.

- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks, making eye contact to indicate you see them.
- Never pass vehicles stopped at crosswalks.
- Stay alert— avoid distracted driving.
- Do not drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

Safety Tip: Stiff joints and muscles can make it harder to check traffic. When walking, turn your whole body - not just your neck - to scan for traffic. As your flexibility increases, so will your ability to be safe.
