





## Shingles (Herpes Zoster)

Shingles is an outbreak of painful blisters on the skin caused by the same virus that causes chicken pox. The virus stays dormant at the base of nerve roots and may present itself again as shingles. Shingles is contagious to persons who have not had chicken pox or the chicken pox vaccine. Anyone who has had chicken pox is at risk for shingles. But the risk goes up as you get older. About 1 in 3 people in the U.S.A. will develop shingles in their lifetime. Shingles is most common in people over age 50. People with weakened immune systems are at higher risk of getting shingles. This includes those who

- Have immune system diseases such as HIV/AIDS
- Have certain cancers
- Take immunosuppressive drugs after an organ transplant

Your immune system may be weaker when you have an infection or are stressed. This can raise your risk of shingles.

Early signs of shingles include burning, shooting pain, tingling, or itching on one side of the body or face. The pain can be mild or severe. One to 14 days later a rash will appear. Complications may include severe long-term pain or blindness if the rash is around the eye.

You can protect yourself from shingles by getting a vaccine, Shingrix, if you are 50 and over. It is two doses over a 2-6 month period. The 2 doses are more than 90% effective in preventing shingles. Even if you had the earlier vaccine, Zostavax, it's recommended to get Shingrix. Most people have a sore arm after the injection and over-the-counter pain relief medication can help. Reaction to each dose may be different. Talk with your provider to see if the vaccine is right for you.
