Lutherans believe that Jesus Christ is present in the Sacrament so that we receive His true body and blood along with the bread and wine (Mark 14:22, 24; 1 Corinthians 10:16). We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20; 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should register with the pastor in his office BEFORE the service begins.

Service Notes: At the time of the Reformation, there were so many “minor festivals”, a commemoration for just about every saint that the church of that day had identified. As the Reformers were working to rework the liturgical calendar, they decided that, with very few exceptions, minor festivals should be only those involving characters from the Bible. We have retained that same thinking, with few exceptions, such as Reformation. Remembering angels and their importance in our lives is to remember how God works in and through them to be with us. Angels serve God by serving us. This is the day to remember them according to what the Bible has to say about them, despite the folklore that exists about them in the world. Paraments are white, the color of holiness, reminding us that angels now are holy as they serve God.

News From Alzheimer's Disease International

News release:

World's largest dementia study reveals two thirds of people think dementia is a normal part of aging, rather than a medical condition. 20 September 2019.

95% of participants think they could develop dementia in their lifetime - a survey of 70,000 people across 155 countries reveals.

- 2 in 3 people still think dementia is a normal part of aging.
- 62% of healthcare practitioners still think it is a normal part of aging.
- Over 50% agree that their own colleagues ignore people living with dementia and 33% thought if they had dementia, they could not be listened to by health professionals.
- 1 in 5 people attribute dementia to bad luck, almost 10 % to God's will and 2 percent to witchcraft.
- Every 3 seconds someone in the world develops dementia.

The World Alzheimer report 2019: Attitudes to dementia, reveals that stigma around dementia is preventing people from seeking the information, advice, support and medical help that could dramatically improve their length and quality of life for what is the world's fastest growing cause of death globally. The number of people living with dementia is forecast to more than triple, from 50 million currently, to 152 million by 2050. The "Let's Talk About Dementia" campaign simply aims to stimulate a conversation about dementia, the warning signs, risk reduction, who to speak to and where to go for advice.
