"You'll shoot your eye out." Choosing Safe Toys

The American Academy of Opthalmology urges parents and others to avoid buying toys that can cause serious eye injury and blindness. According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission an estimated 251,700 toy related injuries were treated in U.S. emergency rooms in 2017. Almost half of those injuries were to the head. Unfortunately most of these injuries happened to children under age 15. It's important to think about the safety of any gift you're giving, especially if it's a gift for a child.

Top Toy Safety Tips

- · Avoid purchasing toys with sharp, protruding, or projectile parts.
- Make sure children have appropriate supervision when playing with potentially hazardous toys or games that could cause eye injury.
- Ensure that laser product labels include a statement that the device complies with 21 CFR (the Code of Federal Regulations) Subchapter J.
- If you give a gift of sports equipment, also give the appropriate protective eyewear with polycarbonate lenses. Check with your opthalmologist to learn about protective gear recommended for your child's sport.
- · Check labels for age recommendations and be sure to select gifts that are appropriate for a child's age and maturity.
- Keep toys that are made for older children away from younger children.

If your child experiences an eye injury from a toy, seek immediate medical attention from an opthalmologist. The good news is that most eye injuries can be easily prevented by following a few safety tips.
