



Welcome in Jesus' Name

Lutherans believe that Jesus Christ is present in the Sacrament so that we receive His true body and blood along with the bread and wine (Mark 14:22, 24; 1 Corinthians 10:16). We further believe that in this Sacrament, we receive the forgiveness of sins (Matthew 26:28) and strength to live an improved Christian life (Galatians 2:20). A worthy communicant is one who is truly repentant of his/her sins and who resolves to amend his/her life (1 Corinthians 11:28). Furthermore, this Sacrament is not only a communion with Christ (Matthew 18:20: 1 Corinthians 10:16), but also with one another (1 Corinthians 10:17; Acts 2:42). Those desiring to commune with us for the first time should register with the pastor in his office BEFORE the service begins.

Announcements

About the cover: The inspiration for the well-known Advent Hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" are "O" antiphons, which considerably pre-date the hymn itself. First reference to them is in the sixth century. They were a part of the monastic worship of the church in the days leading up to Christmas in the end of Advent. The cover illustrates these antiphons, giving them in Latin. "Veni" in Latin means "Come". The specific words for each of the seven antiphons are sapientia, (wisdom); Adonai (Lord); Radix Jesse (tree of Jesse); Clavis David (Key of David); Oriens (morning star); Rex Gentium (King of nations); Emmanuel (which needs no translation, as we know it to be "God with us"). Four of these "O" antiphons will form the basis of our Advent wreath lighting this year.

Advent is a time to think about, and experience, the immense blessings that God wants to give us. He wants to shower us with his love just as powerfully as a cloudburst showers the earth below. He wants to shine his light into our hearts- a light that is a thousand times brighter than the sun. Our work is to slow down, simplify, and listen to the Lord.

Here are some ways you can pray during Advent for simplicity and all that it entails:

- Pray for attentiveness to what truly matters, without being distracted by trivial things.
- Pray for the grace to be able to rest, become aware of God's presence and enjoy
- Pray for peace in all situations, no matter what the circumstances.
- Pray for an enlivened imagination that helps you contribute to the world in creative ways.
- Pray for freedom from all that burdens you- past mistakes, fears, destructive habits, hurts other people have inflicted, and more.
- Pray for opportunities to learn something new regularly.
- Pray for discernment of how God would like you to set your priorities and ability to focus on them consistently to fulfill His purposes in your life.
- Pray for joy and a sense of humor.
- Pray for confidence in God's love for you and trust him in his power to work things out for the best in your life.
- Pray for a clear mind and the ability to clearly communicate what you value to others.
- Pray for openness to the Holy Spirit's guidance.
- Pray for the genuine awareness of God's grace in your life and the humility.
