

Divine Service, Setting Three

Service Notes: Today is the Feast of the Holy Trinity. While other festivals are about God or events in the history of God and His people, this one is about a "doctrine" or teaching of the church. The Trinity is a mystery that can be articulated (explained) but never fully understood. The celebration of this Sunday goes back to 1334, making it the newest regular Sunday in the church year. Lessons either mention or show examples of the eternal Trinity. This Sunday also forms a transition between the two halves of the church year. Advent through Pentecost is the "festival half", which basically chronicles the life of Christ. Next Sunday starts the "non-Festival half" or "ordinary time", which focuses on our lives in Christ. Paraments for Trinity Sunday are white, reminding us of the holiness of the eternal God as Trinity.
