

Distribution: Masks are recommended. Communion for those outside in cars will still be the first part of the Communion distribution. The distribution will take place with the elder and pastor going out the front door and meeting the cars as they pass by the front sidewalk. Communion for those seated inside will follow. Communicants will be ushered to the FRONT of the church by households. Once they have communed, they will return to their pews by the outside aisle. The service will then end with the Communion Liturgy. Pastor will greet (without shaking hands) at the back of the church after church.
