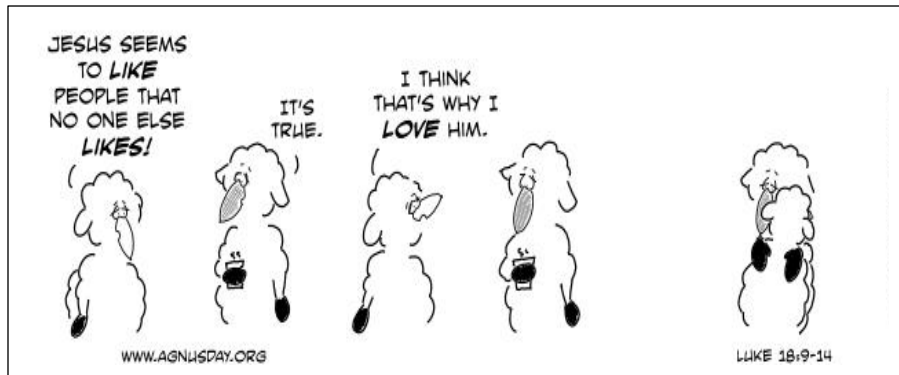

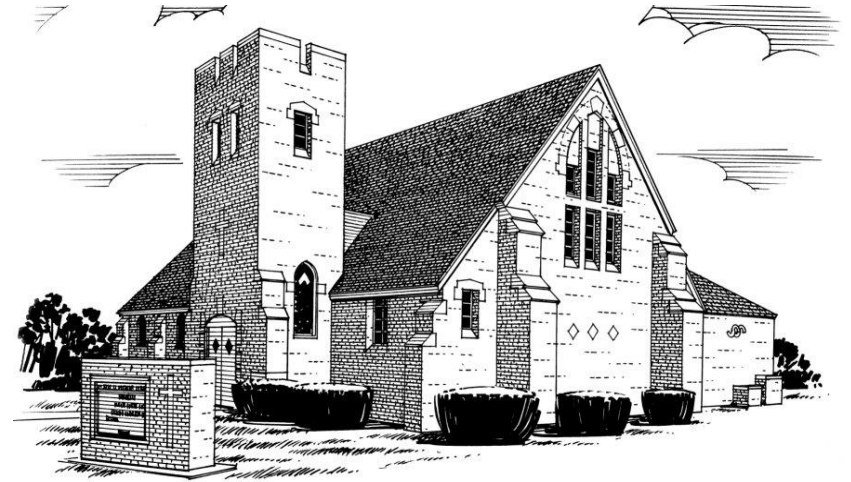

Next Sunday Reformation will be celebrated in our worship service. This past September was the 500th Anniversary of the first printing of Luther's translation of the New Testament in German. Luther left Wartburg castle in May 1522, and in September, the first editions of his newly translated Testament were being printed. That will be the focus of the Reformation this year. A three or four person dramatic reading/skit will help deliver this message to the congregation.
