



<u>Calling all voices!</u> If you would like to be a part of the Christmas Eve Choir, please come to the balcony after church TODAY. We will have a short choir practice on a few verses of our favorite Christmas songs. All are welcome!

<u>Did you know?</u> The "Gloria in Excelsis Deo" is omitted during the season of Advent because it is the joyful song of the angels which was sung by that heavenly choir when Christ was born. The season of Advent is one that stresses repentance, sorrow over sin. Though not as much as Lent, the joy of Advent is "restrained" somewhat as we anticipate celebrating Christ's coming first in time, remembering also that He comes regularly through Word and Sacrament and that He will come at the end of time. Years ago in Lutheran Churches, the color purple was used for both Advent and Lent for the color of the altar paraments as well as the colorful parts of the pastor's robes. Purple is thought to be a color more of sorrow, and so dark blue replaced purple in many churches for the season of Advent. Repentance, sorrow over sin and a desire to do better, is characteristic of both Advent and Lent, but it is stronger in the Lenten season than Advent.
