



<u>Today</u> the Holy Gospel will be presented in part by a "Gospel Motet". The pastor will read the Gospel through verse 9, the Gospel Motet will present verse 10, the congregation will sing stanza 2 of hymn 505, and then the pastor will read the final verse of the Gospel, verse 11. This motet was written a number of years ago by Jan Bender. Pastor McPike first sang this motet just over 50 years ago when he was lead soprano (sixth grade) of the second voice of the Trinity Lutheran School (Indianapolis) choir conducted by Mr. Ronald Becher. The style of the introduction of the motet with discordant notes is meant to represent anguish of Jesus as He faced these temptations in His weakened state after fasting in the wilderness when being approached by the devil.

<u>Thank you</u> to Nick Haggin who sang the prelude for last Sunday's worship service as accompanied by his wife, Alicia. Thank you to Theresa Van Wakeman Wilson for her solo on the hymn for the Ash Wednesday service.
