Divine Setting Three

The Kindling of the New Fire

(In the earliest days of the church, Christians would gather at midnight on Easter Sunday to begin their celebration of Christ's Resurrection from the dead. This service came to be known as the "Great Vigil of Easter". Many lessons would be read over the midnight hours, ending in a service that would celebrate Baptism, where candidates for baptism would be baptized, and those already baptized would join in remembering their own baptism. This service would begin with the fire newly lighted on the paschal candle).

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Introduction

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, following His death on the cross, the body of our Lord Jesus lay in the tomb until early Easter Sunday. Today we are gathered here to celebrate Jesus' resurrection, when He passed from death to life. This is the Passover of the Lord in which, by hearing his Word and celebrating his sacraments, we share in his victory over death.

Let us pray.

O God, you are like a refiner's fire, and your Spirit enkindles the hearts of your faithful people with the fire of your love. Bless, we ask you, this new flame and those who keep this joyful Easter festival that, burning with desire for life with you, we may be found rightly prepared to share in the Feast of Light which has no end; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

Lighting of the Paschal Candle

P: May the light of Christ, who is risen in glory from the dead, scatter all the darkness of our hearts and minds.

C: Amen.

P: The Light of Christ!
C: Thanks be to God!

Easter Proclamation

P: Christ is Risen!

C: HE is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Hymn: "Rejoice, Now, Choir of Angels, Sing!"

(At this point in the Easter Vigil, the congregation would join in an ancient chant that celebrates the first announcement of the Resurrection of Christ from the dead. This chant has been made into hymn form and presented for us to join in singing to the tune of "O Sons and Daughters of the King".)

Rejoice, now, choir of angels sing, And celebrate God's mysteries, Our King has won the victory! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Exult, O earth, with radiance bright, Made brilliant by the King of light. Who has destroyed the gloom of night. Alleluia! Alleluia!

Be glad, oh Church of God, and sing, Christ has destroyed death's venomed sting; Let now this house of worship ring Alleluia! Alleluia! Wherefore, beloved stand with me, And sing God's praise unceasingly, All hail to Christ, Who makes us free. Alleluia! Alleluia!

(stand to sing this stanza)
Glory to God, The Father, Son,
And Holy Spirit, Three in One,
Now and as endless ages run.
Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Amen.

Service of Baptism and Baptismal Renewal

(The Vigil of Easter was traditionally the time for Holy Baptism in the Church. St. Paul connects our baptism with the death and burial of Christ. Today we renew our baptismal vows and prepare for the celebration of Holy Communion. It is here that we reach the very heart of Easter—celebration of Christ's life-giving death and triumph over the powers of sin, death, and darkness.)

P: On this sacred morning, the whole Church of our Lord Jesus Christ recalls his death and burial, rejoicing with great joy in the Gospel of his glorious and mighty resurrection from the dead. The apostle Paul says:

"[Do you not know] that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. If we have been united with him in his death, we will certainly also be united with him in his resurrection. For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be rendered powerless, that we should no longer be slaves to sin--because anyone who has

died has been freed from sin. Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus." (Romans 6:3-11)

The Sacrament of Baptism and an Act of Renewal

(from the Baptismal Font)

P: In Holy Baptism we are forgiven our sins and granted a new life in Christ, our Lord. We solemnly renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways; we confess the gift of faith in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

P: I now ask you: Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

C: I do renounce them.

P: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty?

C: Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son?

C: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

C: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
