Changing Times

I have to tell you, I have seen a lot of change in the first six months of this year. My grandmother died, making my father's generation now the oldest of the family. My parents sold the home I have known since I was 13, and moved to be two hours further away. My oldest daughter got confirmed. That daughter graduated from the eighth grade, finishing school at a place she has been at since the year 2001.

By itself, that can sound rather overwhelming. Yet you know by now that my grandmother was 97, and suffered from significant dementia to the point that she didn't know us anymore. The house that sold had been for sale for two years. Moving further from me meant living right down the street from my sister, which will be a great help when my parents get to the point of needing help. And the passages in my daughter's life... happy times, though with some reflection on how life just keeps "moving on."

We are in a very different place from where we were last year. Last year, our pastor had just recently died. The congregation made a commitment to a vacancy pastor and vicar, and we had just met the man who would be our vicar for a year. We were grieved by the passing of the old, but anticipated the coming of the new.

This year, things are a bit different. We've been a year as vacancy pastor, vicar, and congregation. We've committed ourselves to another year with another vicar. The thing is... we are now faced with saying goodbye to a vicar we have gotten to know rather well, while saying "hello" to a vicar we've yet to meet. And we have very little time in which to make the transition. Vicar Steve leaves June 30, 2010. Vicar Aaron will be installed July 11, 2010.

Congregations taking vicars see a certain rhythm to the year's experience. When the vicar arrives, he is a student, having spent two years studying at seminary, ready for a year of experience but never quite knowing exactly what to expect. It is a time of adjustment for the congregation, and a time of adjustment for the vicar, and a time of adjustment for the supervisor. Any relationship is the sum of its parts. Vicar Aaron will not be Vicar Steve. Such, neither will our relationships be the same. Vicar Steve and Vicar Aaron are different people. We will get to learn how one excels in certain areas and the other in others. Some may relate to one better than the other. That doesn't make either man good or bad, just different. It's a change.

I raise this as a bit of a concern, to get into your minds that things are about to change. Twenty-four years ago (gee... has it been that long??), I was the new vicar, the second vicar, at Grace Lutheran Church, Auburn, Michigan. The first vicar was great with the youth, and had been quite close to some of the young families. I was not so good with the youth, and found the families my age to be less than welcoming. I began to wonder what was wrong with me. The pastor and I spent a bit of time considering the situation, and before long, we discovered that it was not anything negative regarding me. It was that I was not the first vicar. And while the whole congregation knew from the start that vicars only stay one year and then they are gone, they lost sight of that as they grew close to my predecessor over his year among them. When he left, they were surprised by the grief that overtook And they were less than willing to commit themselves to me, because... guess what? One year later, I would be gone, too. As such, it took far longer for me to feel "integrated" into the congregation.

This is something for us to think about. Vicar Aaron will not be Vicar Steve. Vicar Steve is not Vicar Aaron. We've grown to like Vicar Steve. We are comfortable with him. He's done well, he's grown, he's learned. He's not in the same place that he was when he arrived. But Vicar Aaron will be somewhat in the same place early in July that Vicar Steve was a year ago

in July. And we'll get to watch him grow and learn; we'll get to help mold him into being a future pastor in the LCMS.

So, while this year we had no vicar and were anticipating our first, we are challenged this year with saying goodbye to our first and just days later, welcoming our second. And there will be some grief. There always is when the familiar goes away and we have to get used to something different. Our challenge is to be as welcoming to Vicar Aaron as we were to Vicar Steve, while at the same time saying goodbye to Vicar Steve.

Yet we remember, in this as in all that we do, we are not alone, but we live and work and move in the power of Christ and the grace of God. He will bless Vicar Steve as he returns to Fort Wayne to finish his education. He will bless Vicar Aaron as he comes to serve us. And he will bless Immanuel as we continue letting our lights shine in Osman, and the surrounding areas, as God's people.
