### I Gladly Say It! Vicar Aaron Fenker

Luther said that the Christian life is nothing else than a daily Baptism, once begun and ever continued. He also said, "Baptism remains forever. Even though we fall from it and sin, nevertheless we always have access to it so that we may again subdue the old man." In Baptism we truly have enough to study and practice our entire lives. This is true because the benefits offered in our Baptism are no small matter. Baptism works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare (Mark What joy the comfort and consolation of Baptism brings! All the gold of the earth pales in comparison to Baptism. What earthly treasure can bring such great benefits? We can truly sing:

God's own child, I gladly say it:
 I am baptized into Christ!
 He, because I could not pay it,
 Gave my full redemption price.
Do I need earth's treasures many?
I have one worth more than any
That brought me salvation free
 Lasting to eternity!

As Lent approaches we begin to take our annual look at Christ's Passion, but also our sin which caused it. In Lent we pray: "O Lord, make me see Your passion, But its cause to me make known And its termination. Ah! I also and my sin Wrought your deep affliction; This indeed the cause has been Of Your crucifixion" (LSB 440:3, *alt*). Lent has a definite baptismal focus. If we are to focus on our sin and Christ's passion, we can't help but talk about Baptism which gives to us the cleansing flood of Jesus' blood.

Sin, disturb my soul no longer: I am baptized into Christ! I have comfort even stronger: Jesus' cleansing sacrifice. Should a guilty conscience seize me Since my Baptism did release me In a dear forgiving flood, Sprinkling me with Jesus' blood?

Baptism not only washes our sins away but it rescues us from the devil. Baptism in not just plain water, but it is God working in that water. In that water Jesus drowns our ugly foe who would accuse us unceasingly before our heavenly Father (Revelation 12:10). As Pharaoh and his host were drowned, so the devil is drowned, and now Christ is united with us (Galatians 3:27) to conquer this ancient foe.

Satan, hear this proclamation:
I am baptized into Christ!
Drop your ugly accusation,
I am not so soon enticed.
Now that to the font I've traveled,
All your might has come unraveled,
And, against your tyranny,
God, my Lord, unites with me!

Through Baptism Jesus not only delivers us from the devil, but He delivers us from the curse which sin brought into the world: death. We shall all surely die. We are dust and to dust we shall return as we confess on Ash Wednesday, but we've already been united to a death - Jesus'. Jesus promised paradise to the thief on the cross, and we receive it too because as surely as we've been united to Christ's death, we've been united to His resurrection. Not even death can take away our baptismal joy!

Death you cannot end my gladness:
 I am baptized into Christ!
 When I die, I leave all sadness
 To inherit paradise!
 Though I lie in dust and ashes
 Faith's assurance brightly flashes:
 Baptism has the strength divine
 To make life immortal mine.

In Baptism we truly have enough to study our whole life. All the benefits of baptism are true. It

truly brings and promises victory over death and the devil, forgiveness of sins, God's grace, the entire Christ, and the Holy Spirit with His gifts. The gifts are so bountiful we may doubt that it's all true. But it is true. There is no reason to doubt, but every reason to rejoice! How glorious are the gifts given to us when we were washed with water and word at the Holy Font. And those gifts last forever because Baptism remains forever!

There is nothing worth comparing
To this life-long comfort sure!
Open-eyed my grave is staring:
Even there I'll sleep secure.
Though my flesh awaits its raising,
Still my soul continues praising:
I am baptized into Christ;
I'm a child of paradise!

### Personal Note from Pastor McPike

Greetings! I just wanted to share with you what is going on in my "other life," so that you have an understanding of how busy things have been.

In November, the "General Medical Unit" chaplain

In November, the "General Medical Unit" chaplain resigned and left. Carle Pastoral Care Department has four full-time chaplains, so naturally if one leaves that is twenty-five percent of our work-force. We have been searching for another chaplain since. Someone is hired and will be starting in orientation at Carle on March 7, 2011.

In early February, our Pediatric chaplain gave her notice that she was taking a job at a hospital in southwest Michigan. Her last day was February 28. That is now 50% of our department. The search is on to find her replacement.

We currently have three "PRN" chaplains (PRN in the medical world means "as needed") who cover call for us, especially on the weekends. One of those three is not able to cover call because his father is dying in Texas. Another has other obligations that are causing her to need to scale back. The short story there is, right now we have only three of us covering 24/7 call at Carle. I did ten nights of call last month, and am scheduled for ten nights this coming month. Sadly, I won't be available for too many of the Wednesday midweek services this year because of having to stay in C-U to cover call.

I am hopeful this situation will resolve by May! The vacant position has been approved and interviews are forthcoming, and we had a fourth "PRN" position approved and are now searching for someone for that. When things are all settled, I will be back to four

nights a month on call at Carle, less tired and more available at Osman!

# Divine Drama Bible Study Pastor Jeff McPike

Come join the adult study on Sunday mornings as we journey through the Old Testament toward the time of Christ, always highlighting how the events in the Old Testament lead up to the time of Christ. "The Divine Drama" is so named because the entire Old Testament "sets the stage" in a rather dramatic form for the coming and work of Christ. Each week presents colorful illustrations that are reminders and illustrations of the major points of each lesson.

### <u>Lenten Season</u> Pastor Jeff McPike

The Lenten season, a 40 day period that precedes Easter, is a time that church has traditionally set aside to focus on the passion of Christ and what it means for our forgiveness. It is a time of reflection. It is a time of repentance. It is a time of self-examination. And it is a time when Lutherans traditionally have held Wednesday evening services starting with Ash Wednesday.

This year, Vicar will be presenting a sermon series that will highlight the Passion of Christ by using the "passions," or those things that the first president of both Concordia Seminary and the LCMS, Dr. C. F. W. Walther, was passionate about. Walther was a key figure in the early history of the LCMS, and much of the way in which our congregational structure continues to be a part of our synod was formulated directly from early struggles within the group of Saxons who immigrated from Germany to around St. Louis in 1839. Dr. Walther was chosen as a sort of "theme" for this year not only because he is influential, but also because he was born 200 years ago in 1811 in Germany.

This year at Immanuel, we will again observe Lent with midweek services, starting with Ash Wednesday that will feature special paraments that will dress the chancel in "sack cloth," a reminder of the ancient symbol of repentance and sorrow, where one would sit in "sack cloth" and put ashes on one's head. A meal will precede the Ash Wednesday service in the Hall. The paraments were made by our Altar Guild ladies. On Maundy Thursday, we will celebrate communion using only the Common Cup, which has been a tradition observed in Lutheranism and here at Immanuel sometimes in the past.

Come join us in remembrance of our Lord's passion and the wonderful gifts God has given us in Christ, the forgiveness He won on the cross,

culminating in His victory over sin and death on Easter.

### **Church Council Minutes**

The following items were discussed at the Church Council Meeting held on Tuesday, February 8, 2011 at 7:00 p.m.:

Members attending: Lee Whitehouse, Mike Hendricks, Darwin Warsaw, Aaron Warsaw, Jill Hardesty, Vicar Aaron Fenker, and Pastor Jeff McPike.

The meeting was held in the Annex with Pastor McPike opening the meeting with prayer.

Secretary Jill Hardesty read the minutes from the January meeting with one amended correction in the Pastor Report from January regarding the Altar Guild. Mike Hendricks made a motion to amend the correction. Second by Darwin Warsaw. Motion carried.

Treasurer Mike Hendricks gave the <u>Treasurer's Report</u> with a balance of \$51,768.72 as of January 31, 2011. A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report was made by Darwin Warsaw. Second by Aaron Warsaw. Motion carried.

Treasurer Mike Hendricks also discussed the following:

We have about \$300.00 to put towards discretionary causes. Discussion was held on what organization to donate the money to for January/February. Darwin Warsaw made a motion to give \$150.00 for January to the Orphan Grain Train and \$150.00 for the same organization. Second by Aaron Warsaw. Motion carried.

Also, the Church Extension Fund was discussed by Mike Hendricks with a floating CD in St. Louis, where we also have the Herman Meyer Fund. This fund pays 2% interest and would take \$20,000.00 from the current general checking account to draw more interest. If we need the money before the CD is up, we can leave \$5,000.00 in the account and draw the money out to use. A motion was made by Darwin Warsaw to remove \$20,000.00 from the general checking account and send it to the Church Extension Fund in St. Louis, MO. Second by Aaron Warsaw. Motion carried.

The <u>Pastor's Report</u> by Pastor McPike mentioned that prayers were needed for Pastor Don Ehlers from Champaign St. John's Lutheran Church who has been diagnosed with cancer.

Either Pastor or Vicar Aaron will fill in for Pastor Allen at the Loda church on February 27, 2011 and not be at Osman that Sunday. They will work it out between them.

Fellowship Club will meet on February 20, 2011. In the future, it's being determined if we should meet on Saturday evenings instead of Sunday evenings. The Divine Drama materials have been ordered for the Lenten timeframe for Bible Study.

Altar Guild Chairman Debbie Lammle approached Pastor McPike about needing additional communion cards for the church. Jill Hardesty will advise Debbie where to have them made, as in the past.

Pastor McPike also reported that the Altar Guild will be using brown burlap for the paraments for Ash Wednesday with black symbols and is making those preparations for that now. The Altar Guild has also asked to purchase new white paraments for the Easter season and to approve a new Easter banner also with memorial monies. A motion was made by Mike Hendricks to purchase the new white paraments and banner with memorial monies. Second by Jill Hardesty. Motion carried.

Pastor McPike also thanked the Trustees that assisted in shoring up the flooring in the Annex and office area: Mark Barrack, Don Warsaw, Steve Martin, Shane Zimmerman, Wade Warsaw, and Darwin Warsaw.

Vicar Aaron reported that he truly appreciated all of the gifts from the Council and congregation during the holidays and feels blessed to be here.

Vicar Aaron attended the Pastor's Circuit Meeting in Danville.

The choir has been introduced to a new hymn for the lent season and the congregation will be hearing it very soon in some portion of the Sunday services.

The Lenten lessons from the pulpit will be taught during the Lenten season.

Bible Study continues on Wednesdays.

Darwin Warsaw reported on the <u>Trustees Report</u>. He told about the floors in the Annex and the walls that were going to need caring for due to rotting of the wall plate at the bottom of the wall and the footing of the building. The floors are now shored up, but the walls will be done at a later time, after winter. Thank you to Mark Barrack, Don Warsaw, Steve Martin, Shane Zimmerman, Wade Warsaw, and Darwin Warsaw for their expert carpenter skills.

The door closer to the front church door project has not been completed.

Darwin Warsaw handed out a tentative 2011 Mowing Schedule. If you do not want to be on the Mowing Schedule, please let Darwin know.

The offering plates have been taken to get replated. They will be gone for about four weeks.

In <u>Old Business</u>, discussion took place as to the Constitution and By-Law's proposed changes. The changes will need to be voted on in two separate voters meetings. Both of those votes will take place in April and July 2011. Please refer to the November and December newsletters on the website for reference. As discussed at the Annual Voters Meeting in January,

the congregation voted to look for an accounting firm for payroll and tax assistance.

Treasurer Mike Hendricks prefers to keep the payroll in-house for now. He noted that he will check with some local accounting firms for prices of monthly services and yearly auditing of the Treasurer's books. The results will be discussed at the next Quarterly Voters Meeting in April.

There was no New Business to report.

The next Church Council Meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 8, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. in the Annex.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Darwin Warsaw. Second by Aaron Warsaw. Motion carried with adjournment at 8:25 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

The group approved the selection of new white paraments for Christmas and Easter.

Discussion was held concerning no flowers, banners, or flower stands to be used during Lent. If members want to donate fresh flower arrangements during the season of Lent, they may be used during the Sunday morning service only. Geraniums will be used to decorate the altar during Pentecost Sunday. It

was suggested that Karen Bryan inform the congregation on the church calendar included in the newsletter as to when communion will be celebrated during the year.

The Lois Christie Memorial will be used to purchase blue oil-filled candles for the Advent Wreath and two banners, one for Easter and one for Christmas. A confirmation robe will be ordered for confirmation on Palm Sunday, April 17, 2011.
