Christian Education is for everyone. Sunday, September 11 will be our Christian Education kickoff at Immanuel. Different churches call it by different names. Some churches use the name "Rally Day" - for that is the day that we rally back together after the summer break to have our educational activities again. In the past at Immanuel, I believe it has also been called "promotion day," the day that students are moved on to the next grade level.

I like *Christian Education Sunday*, because Christian Education is for every grade, every age, every part of life. As such, we have Christian Educational activities for the smallest children right up through the adults. Catechism for youth starts, thanks to Debbie Lammle agreeing to teach the class. Since the pastor is usually responsible for the teaching of Catechism, I will be working with her in this endeavor. I opted to ask Debbie to do this because I wanted to remain free to teach the Adult Bible Class on Sunday morning, as we are continuing to work through "The Divine Drama." This class presents a wonderful overview of the whole history of God's people in the Old Testament leading up to the coming and work of Christ.

With no vicar this year, one thing that Vicar Fenker started this past year was a midweek evening Bible Class. I feel like that is something that should receive some attention, though I am still working out the details of how to accomplish that. I will release more when I know more.

Luther Tour 2012?

Pastor McPike is considering a tour of the Luther sites in Germany in July 2012. This tour is only in the very earliest of thinking stages at this time. In earliest investigations, it would seem that the price will be in the vague ballpark of \$4,000.00 per person based on double occupancy, and the tour will be somewhere in the area of 10 to 12 days long. Sites to be included will be Eisleben (where Luther was born, baptized, and

died); Eisenach (where Luther lived as a schoolboy; near there is the majestic fortress known as Wartburg Castle where Luther was in hiding for nearly a year and translated the New Testament from Greek to German); Erfurt (where Luther became a Monk and attended University); Wittenberg (where Luther taught and lived much of his life); Leipzig (many years the home of Lutheran Kantor J. S. Bach at St. Thomas Church); and Worms (where Luther stated clearly "Here I stand" before the Holy Roman Emperor, Charles V).

In addition, we hope to see places like Berlin, Rüdesheim (a lovely village on the Rhine River), as well as many sites along the way. There may be other areas such as the Black Forest, Munich, and possibly even Switzerland. There are lots of details to work out, and we are just getting started.

Please contact Pastor McPike if you are at all interested. No commitment necessary at this point in time! We just want to get an idea of the interest as we move forward.

Pastor McPike has been to Germany five times, and has lead three Luther-land tours. You will come back with a new understanding of our Lutheran heritage.

Quarterly Voters Meeting

The July Quarterly Voters Meeting was called to order in the church on July 10, 2011, by Chairman Lee Whitehouse with Pastor McPike opening the meeting with prayer. There were 43 voting members present.

Chairman Whitehouse asked if anyone needed to sign the church constitution; no one came forward.

Secretary Jill Hardesty read the minutes from the January Voters Meeting. One correction to the April minutes were that the proposal to change the church's constitution did not need two votes. It only needs the proposal at one meeting, with a vote being at the next meeting for any changes to be made. No other additions or corrections were noted.

Darwin Warsaw made a motion to approve the January minutes. Second by Rick Hardesty. Motion carried.

Treasurer Mike Hendricks gave an overview of the quarterly <u>Treasurer's Report</u> to the congregation with a balance, as of June 30, 2011, of \$63,491.40. A motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Rick Hardesty. Second by Larry Camp. Motion carried.

The <u>Pastor's Report</u> was given by Pastor McPike. Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman has been notified that we will not be receiving a Vicar for the upcoming year. Pastor suggested that we use this time for a six month evaluation period until the January 2012 meeting. At that time, then make a decision if the congregation would like to call a pastor or any other options that would come along.

- Pastor thanked the Bible School Superintendents, Teachers, helpers and students for a great Bible School in June.
- Bible Class will resume on Sunday, July 17, 2011.
- Pastor spoke out about outreaching into the community and especially to the parishioners from the Mahomet Christ Lutheran Mission Church now that they have closed.
- Pastor has asked Debbie Lammle to teach the new confirmand's Catechism for the upcoming year.
- A membership transfer was received from Scott and Rebecca Gercken to St. Paul's Lutheran in Blue Point. Also, a new member request was received from Harry, Jeannine, Alecia, and Eric Henriksen from St. John's Lutheran, Champaign, to Immanuel of Osman. We welcome the Henriksen's into our church family.

In <u>Old Business</u>, Chairman Whitehouse stated that the sanctuary lighting project was completed and the roofline project is in the works for this fall, once schedules are secured.

- Chairman Whitehouse then asked Pastor McPike to speak about the Constitution and By-law's proposed rule changes for a unified ballot to get one candidate for each church office for the slate of officers. After further discussion, he called for a vote. Darwin Warsaw made a motion for the church to amend the Constitution and By-laws, as stated above. Second by Annette Warsaw. Motion carried.
- Also, Chairman Whitehouse commented on the possibility of adding new double doors to the North entrance of the Fellowship Hall. Darwin Warsaw suggested metal doors for that entrance. A motion to form a committee was

made by John Gercken. Second by Brenda Hendricks. Motion carried. Preliminary costs would be about \$4,000.00 for a 72" door.

In <u>New Business</u>, discussion was held about the possibility of rental of the Fellowship Hall by a local funeral home for local visitations. Donation verses charging the funeral home was discussed and if Immanuel wanted people to be a member or not of the church. Discussion continued. Chairman Whitehouse will invite Mr. Belangee to the August Council Meeting for clarification on several items before a decision is made. The Council will report back to the congregation at the October Voters Meeting on October 9, 2011.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Barb Whitehouse-Gercken. Second by Don Warsaw. Motion carried with adjournment by all with the Lord's Prayer. Respectfully submitted, Jill Hardesty

Church Council Meeting

The following items were discussed at the Church Council Meeting held on Tuesday, August 16, 2011, at 7:00 p.m. Pastor McPike opened the meeting with prayer from Matthew 15 beginning at verse 21.

Members in attendance: Mike Hendricks, Darwin Warsaw, Jill Hardesty, Larry Lutz, Annette Warsaw, Lee Whitehouse, Kim Clemmons, and Pastor McPike. One visitor was in attendance, Elvin Belangee.

Treasurer's Report:

Treasurer Mike Hendricks gave the Treasurer's Report with a balance of \$67,402.29 as of July 30, 2011. A motion to approve the Treasurer's Report was made by Kim Clemmons. Second by Darwin Warsaw. Motion carried.

Treasurer Hendricks also discussed the following:

- Treasurer Hendricks also told the Council about the Church Extension Fund movement of \$20,000 to be transferred on August 17, 2011. The fund pays 1.125% interest and the money can be withdrawn at any time.
- Also, Osman received a donation from a member of Thrivent Choice for \$398.00. An email was received by the church notifying us of the donation.
- The debit card/credit card option will be available soon from First Mid-Illini Bank in Mansfield, if you bank with them. You can give your donations thru those cards to Immanuel Lutheran of Osman. More information will be coming soon.

Pastor's Report:

• Pastor McPike reported that Pastor Schmidt will act as a "fill in" for Pastor McPike in his absence. He will receive \$200.00 per service plus mileage.

- The Altar Guild would like to meet with the Trustees soon about some storage cabinet ideas for the storage of altar equipment/
- *Christian Education Sunday* will be on Sunday, September 11, 2011.
- Debbie Lammle has been asked to teach the confirmation classes this year. Pastor would like to order a book, copies of the Catechism book, and a Concordia Study Bible for them. Darwin Warsaw made a motion to order all of those items and present it to them on *Christian Education Sunday*. Second by Kim Clemmons. Motion carried.
- Pastor is considering being in the church office on Tuesday evenings on a regular basis. Also, possibly midweek Bible Study. He'll check his schedule and report back.
- The worship service for the picnic Sunday will be printed out.
- Pastor is also considering a special bulletin during Reformation. Treasurer Hendricks also told the Council about the Church Extension Fund movement

<u>Elder's Report</u>: There was no Elder's Report. <u>Sunday School Superintendent's Report</u>:

<u>Trustee's Report</u>:

- Visitor Elvin Belangee was at the meeting to answer questions about the possibility of using the Osman Fellowship Hall for funeral visitations. A lot of discussion was held with regard to janitorial service, setting up and taking down of chairs and tables, snow removal, etc. He and Trustee Darwin Warsaw made a visit to the Hall and Elvin decided that it'd be best to offer this to Immanuel church members only. He indicated that most everyone in the Bellflower/Farmer City areas use the churches in the area and the churches were fine with that. This issue is closed with no further action taken.
- Trustee Darwin Warsaw has completed the door closer issues on the front door.
- Also, Warsaw noted that the new eaves on the back side of the Annex is on schedule for this fall. He's just now trying to get times when the work can be completed.
