Church Council Minutes December 3, 2013 (Abridged Edition)

8 members, plus Pastor McPike, attended the monthly council meeting held on December 3, in the fellowship hall.

Secretary's minutes were read and approved. Treasurer Bob Zimmerman reported the cash balance being \$85,146.35. This did not include the Thanksgiving service offering which will be reflected in the January report. Report was approved. The Mahomet Schools program for needy children will be the recipient of our December mission giving. For January we will give \$450 from our needy fund and

\$150 of our monthly mission money for a total of \$600 to St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Gifford who organized the projects for the Gifford tornado victims.

Nikki Gallier reported that the children's program practices has begun. She also informed us that the high school Bible class on Sunday mornings has resumed with Joy Johnson as teacher. She has about 4-5 students each week.

John Gercken, trustee, reported that all of the lights in the sanctuary have been changed to CFL bulbs. Steve Warsaw verified that he would get the Christmas tree for the church this week.

The storage shed clean up was reported on. The building of the new shelf for the television in the hall is in progress.

The letter of resignation from Rick and Jill Hardesty for the youth group directors was read. Nikki and Rob Gallier are willing to take this position over starting in 2014.

The 2014 proposed budget was discussed. It will be available in the January newsletter and is also available on the back elders pew for all members to view before the quarterly voters meeting.

The time line for the tuck pointing job on the church was discussed. Dick Johnson gave the quote of \$300 for installing the fascia boards and wrapping them. The council approved this bid. The council agreed to bring before the voters the quote from Alternative Enterprises for \$1250 for the drainage of the water away from the building and the quote from Dalton Seamless Guttering for \$800 for the gutters at the quarterly voters meeting.

The next council meeting will be January 7. The next quarterly voters meeting will be Sunday, January 12.




