<u>Church Council Minutes</u> <u>July 2, 2014</u> (<u>Abridged Edition</u>)

6 members, plus Pastor McPike, attended the monthly council meeting held on July 2, in the fellowship hall.

Secretary's minutes were read and approved. Treasurer Bob Zimmerman reported the cash balance as \$61,165.05. The July mission giving project was approved for Pastor Peter Kolb from the Altamont area who is raising money to start his missionary work. The August mission giving project was approved for Orphan Grain Train, specifically for the Pilger, Nebraska area which was damaged by tornadoes in June.

Pastor McPike reported on the status of summer vicar, Kurt Cockran. Pastor Deen will fill in for two Sundays in August. There has not been a formal financial agreement set up with Pastor Deen at this time.

Beth Bidner reported on the update of Vacation Bible School. She had to order craft supplies from two different suppliers. The offering from VBS will go to Salt and Light in Champaign. The float in the Bellflower parade will advertise VBS. The children will give a short program on Sunday, July 20th, during the worship service.

Jeff Warsaw gave the trustees report. Chief Bauer has us scheduled for the duct work. The church sign on Route #54 was been fixed. After the tuck pointing is complete, the ceiling fans will need to be cleaned so maybe at this time we need to consider buying new ones which have a reverse option to circulate the air better.

Chairman Hardesty gave the update on the tuck pointing project. There will be an additional cost for the matching bricks that were needed for the columns where there was so much water damage.

Pastor led the report on the internet installation. He met with the internet provider last month. There does not seem to be a signal to the fellowship hall due to many trees. One option was to install a 2 inch pipe to the top of a pole by the railroad to get a height that would receive the signal. However since this is railroad property, we would have to ask permission. The other option is to install a pole on our property if there is a place where a signal can be received. Pastor has the equipment to get it installed to our buildings once we get a signal. However, since this delay, it will not be available for Vacation Bible School.

In new business, it was discussed that the new acolytes from the upcoming Confirmation Class need to be trained in September since we do not have many acolytes for the worship services. The council gave the approval for the curtains to be removed at the back of the church under the balcony. It was also suggested that we have a thank you printed from our church to send to the families that donate memorial money. It was approved to purchase a case for the new lap top computer.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

<u>Quarterly Church Council Minutes</u> <u>July 6, 2014</u> (Abridged Edition)

36 voting members attended the quarterly voter's meeting held on July 6, 2014, after the regular worship service.

Secretary's minutes were read and approved. Treasurer Bob Zimmerman reported the cash balance as being \$61,165.05 at the end of June.

Pastor McPike elaborated on the presence of our church in the Bellflower area. If you use the Google search engine you can find our church listed as well as the directions. The advertising budget is being used to put ads in the local papers. Pastor then explained that our summer vicar, Kurt Cockran, has asked for extension of time off due to personal circumstances. The council has made adjustments in his salary. Pastor Deen will be coming back on board in August for 2 Sundays a month.

Chairman Hardesty then updated the congregation on the tuck point project. They should be wrapping things up in two weeks. There was tremendous amount of damage done to the columns where the bricks absorbed the moisture. They used some of our extra bricks but had to purchase new bricks. After the columns are reconstructed, they still need to acid wash and seal the windows. Chairman Hardesty asked for a motion not to exceed \$1000 to finish the project. Diana Zimmerman made the motion and Darryl Redding seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The contractor once again stressed the importance of guttering. As soon as the tuck pointing is complete, Dalton Seamless Guttering is ready to begin the next phase of the project. Dick Johnson will work with them getting the fascia boards completed. Dick will also install the lentil and the seal for the window in the annex.

The duct work for the cold air returns has been scheduled with Chief Bauer. The road signs advertising our church have been repaired. Some of them are located off the side of the road so far that they are easily missed.

The missing church key has been located. John Gercken suggested looking into an electronic code entry with a single code so that you do not have to change it. The cost of these will be researched before we agree to go with that method.

Chairman Hardesty then explained the steps that have been taken to acquire internet for the church and hall. The trees seem to be blocking the signal coming into the hall so the Data Net provider did not recommend his service for a weak signal. We are in the process of investigating if we can install our own pole on the church property to get the height that we need to clear the obstructions. The process has been delayed but hopefully not forgotten.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Church Picnic


