Advent

Advent begins November 30 this year, and with it comes the blue paraments and advent wreath. The word "advent" is from the Latin word for "coming", and describes the "coming" of our Lord Jesus Christ into the flesh. Advent begins the church year because the church year begins where Jesus' earthly life began. After Advent comes Christmas, which is about his birth. Then Epiphany, about his miracles and ministry, Lent - about his Calvary-bound mission, then Easter about his resurrection and the sending of the apostles, Ascension (40 days after Easter) and Pentecost, with the sending of the Holy Spirit.

The traditional use of Advent candles originated in eastern Germany even prior to the Reformation. As this tradition came down to us by the beginning of this century, it involved three blue or purple candles and one pink. The blue or purple candles match the paraments on the altar. The pink candle was the third candle to be lit (not the fourth) on the Third Sunday of Advent, called Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" means "rejoice" in Latin, which is taken from Philippians 4:4. Hence a "pink" candle was used to signify "rejoicing". Some also included a white "Christ Candle" in the middle of the advent wreath to be lit during the 12 days of Christmas (December 25 - January 5). The concept of giving each candle a name, i.e. Prophecy, Bethlehem, Shepherd, and Angel is a relatively novel phenomenon and probably originated with the early sales of Advent candles and devotional booklets.

May we all rejoice in the coming of our Savior this Advent Season!

Church Council Minutes November 4, 2014 (Abridged Edition)

6 members, plus Pastor McPike, attended the monthly council meeting held on November 4 in the fellowship hall.

Secretary's minutes were read and approved. Treasurer Bob Zimmerman reported the cash balance as \$68,909.93 as of the end of October. Our monthly mission giving had already been approved at an earlier monthly meeting. It will be the Blue Ridge School District's back pack program.

Pastor McPike thanked the congregation for Pastor Appreciation Sunday. He reported that Confirmation Class is underway. Pastor Deen is helping with that. He reported that he is working on two new Bible studies for adult Bible class. One is on the book of Daniel and one is on the flood. He will advertise those in the church bulletin when completed. He is still working on the voice mail on the answering machine in the office. He also is editing the Christmas program which was purchased from Concordia to fit our Sunday school population.

In old business Chairman Hardesty reported that the guttering is completed on the church. He was very satisfied with Dalton Guttering on the job done. Examples of church thank yous designed by Annette Warsaw were displayed for the council to choose which one we liked. Pastor McPike brought a sample of a wood insert that will work to keep the Christmas greenery more stable around the perimeter of the church. Bob Zimmerman agreed to purchase more and get them installed before the decorations go up.

In new business the date for the Advent service was set for Wednesday, December 3rd. The Ladies Aid will prepare a soup supper to be served before the service. The Christmas decorating schedule was set. A quote to build a door on the cabinet that holds the banners in the altar guild room was presented for \$500. It was approved. Bob Zimmerman presented the proposed 2015 budget. The council discussed the changes. It will be printed and put on the back elders' pew for members to view before the quarterly meeting in January.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
