8 members, plus Pastor McPike, attended the monthly council meeting held on December 2 in the fellowship hall. Secretary's minutes were read and approved. Treasurer Bob Zimmerman reported the cash balance as \$70,218 as of the end of November. Our monthly mission giving had already been approved at an earlier monthly meeting. It will be the Fisher Food Pantry for the month of December.

Pastor McPike reported that his Bible study on Daniel will begin in January. He felt that the Thanksgiving dinner and service went well and was very appreciative that this change allowed him to preach. He then explained the schedule for decorating the church in a progressive way.

Sunday School Superintendent, Beth Bidner, was not present, but Annette Warsaw gave her report that the Christmas program practice as going well. They would be doing Christmas camp on Saturday, December 6th with crafts, food, and practice.

The Trustees reported that furnace filters had been changed. Some work on outside light on the deck of the fellowship hall had been done. An estimate on new ceiling fans for the church had been received by Jeff Warsaw.

Thrivent News

This month our congregation received \$283 in Thrivent Choice dollars. Thank you to Carolyn Majercin, Steve Martin and Rev. Jeffrey McPike. As of Nov. 30, 2014 our church has received \$3,497 in Choice Dollars. Last year we received \$2,573 so that is a nice increase. You have until March 31, 2015 to allocate Choice Dollars for 2014 so please don't let those dollars expire without designating them. You can call 1-800-847-4836 and when prompted say "Thrivent Choice" and when next prompted say "Choice Dollars". You can also do it online.

We have just received word that our region will transition to the new Thrivent Member Network as of July 1, 2015. At that time, the McLean County Chapter will no long exist and everything will change in the way projects have been done. Each Thrivent member can lead two Community Action Teams per year. Each team will receive an action kit and a \$250 pre-paid debit card for the Action Team expenses associated with the project. You must submit your request 21 days in advance of the event to the Regional Board. We will let you know more information as we learn it.

If we want to do another benefit under the old system, we need to decide ASAP and get it to the board by their January 24th meeting. Funding was reduced by 65% and now that amount has been cut in half since the chapter will only operate for the first six months of the year. We will meet on January 18th for a very short meeting in the Annex after church.
