From the desk of Pastor Deen...

"Stench"

No! You are not smelling things. No! You are not the only who smells that. And No! You are not the only one ignoring that. You are not the only one that can smell that disgusting rotting smell emanating from the back of your fridge. It's not just you. Everyone who opens that door, can't help but smell it, but no one, including you wants to deal with it. But you have to, because at this point you are gagging form the stench that is your fridge. So, you check the crisper, hoping that it's in there, when you know in your heart of hearts it's not. You find nothing but the apples, carrots and celery. The fridge still reeks, so finally you bite the bullet, you reach down the bottom shelf, move the milk, set aside the dressing, slide the leftovers to the side, remove the box of Arm & Hammer and there it sits. The source of the stench, in one of your favorite Tupperware containers there it sits, and there it stinks, there it reeks, there it awaits your daring recovery of itself. You reach in to grab it with both hands, and hold on tight, because the last thing you want is for this thing to spill on the floor. You grab it, and very slowly you back up, careful not to spill it, set it down, step away and gather yourself. And with nerves of steel, and with steady hands that would make a bomb squad expert proud, you remove the top of the container. And what stares you back in the face is a mass of slightly fuzzy, multi-colored, coagulating substance that is not fit for human or warthog consumption, and once upon a time ago was food but now cannot be considered that by anyone.

And as you by default have been charged with the task of throwing this away, you wonder, how did we get here...Think back six weeks ago. Week one, this meal was made, and while it was no gourmet meal, it wasn't the worst thing you've ever tasted. The meal was consumed and the leftovers were placed in that Tupperware container with the lid on tight, to ensure it's ability to be eaten. Day one came and day one went...and the leftovers sat. Day two, three, and four came, and day two, three, and four went and you found something better to eat while the leftovers sat. Day five came, and so did that new gallon of milk that pushed that meal to the back. Osman Lutheran Church Council Meeting May 6, 2015

The Osman Lutheran Church Council met on May 6th with 8 members present. Those attending were Rick Hardesty, Bob Zimmerman, Debbie Lammle, Shane Zimmerman, Jeff Warsaw, Connie Warsaw, Susie Martin, and Diana Zimmerman.

Don Warsaw addressed the council concerning possible need for a drainage tile north of the church and a catch basin in the parking lot west of the church. Discussion on mold at the top of the church was also held. It was suggested that the area be cleaned and that the temperature setting on the AC be decreased when high humidity exists in the church.

The meeting was then called to order by Chairman Hardesty. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as amended. Motion made by Jeff Warsaw and seconded by Shane Zimmerman.

Bob Zimmerman read the treasurer's report with a balance of \$75,731.45. A motion was made and seconded to accept the report. A change to the Herman Meyer CD will be made, since a portion of the account will be sent to the St. Louis Seminary. Treasurer, Bob Zimmerman, was given authority by the council to adjust the purchase of propane purchased for the year by the amount we were short last year. Bob Zimmerman will also ask the LP dealer about a manual shut off on all three gas lines and if the regulator is anchored correctly.

In Pastor McPike's absence, Chairman Hardesty stated that since there are a shortage of vicars, we will probably not have one this summer. Information will be placed in the bulletin to alert the congregation.

SS Superintendent's Report:

Jeff Warsaw reported in the absence of the Sunday School Superintendent that VBS will be held July 12-16. Supplies and T-shirts have been ordered.

Trustee's Report:

Jeff Warsaw reported that Chief Bauer will be checking the air conditioning units on May 15th. Annex windows, doors, and fascia are on the list to be completed by the end of the year. Jeff continued to present the estimate from Brandon Clemmons from Amplified Electric for two 68 inch fans, ladder rental, one 56 inch fan, and labor at a total of \$1,000. The fans have reverse capability, remotes, and lights.

Elder's Report:

Secretary, Linda Warsaw, was given the elder's schedule for the rest of the year.

Twenty five thank you cards were donated to the

church and were placed in the Pastor's office.

Shirley Sprau reserved the pavilion for the annual church picnic for August 9th.

After discussion on the temperature to set the AC during the week in the summer, it was suggested by the council to set at 78 degrees and adjust accordingly as humidity changes.

Jeff Warsaw was asked to get two estimates for checking the area at the top of the church for mold.

It was suggested that we check on printing less bulletins for Sunday morning services because of the large number of bulletins left after each service.

Discussion was then held on using paid staff for Immanuel Osman events.

After discussion on borrowing tables and chairs from the Fellowship Hall, Diana Zimmerman made a motion that the old tables and folding chairs may be used by church members if approved by a trustee, returned in the same condition as they were taken, and replaced if damaged during the use of the individuals. Jeff Warsaw seconded . Motion carried. Jeff Warsaw made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Diana Zimmerman seconded. Motion carried. Meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.
