Osman Lutheran Church Council Minutes August 5, 2015

The Osman Lutheran Church Council met for its monthly meeting on August 5, 2015. Those present were Rick Hardesty, Debbie Lammle, Bob Zimmerman, Susie Martin, Diana Zimmerman, Steve Martin, Shane Zimmerman, Jeff Warsaw, Connie Warsaw, and Pastor McPike. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Hardesty. Pastor McPike's devotion was from Psalm 145: 10-21, followed by prayer. Debbie Lammle read the minutes from the July meeting. Diana Zimmerman made a motion to approve; Connie Warsaw seconded; motion carried. The treasurer's report was given by Bob Zimmerman, with a balance in the treasury of \$82,507.64. Connie Warsaw made a motion to approve; Shane Zimmerman seconded; motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor began his report directing several thank yous to the congregation for their support and generous contributions, VBS staff for a great job, and to the Gerckens for transporting Sara during the week of Bible School. Pastor stated we would not publicize the key code for the locks on the church and hall. He suggested having an Octoberfest celebration on October 25th to commemorate the Reformation. Pastor McPike also informed the council that the laminated cards explaining Holy Communion were ordered. General discussion continued on church security.

Christian Education Sunday will be celebrated on August 30th during the church service. Communion will be celebrated on the third and fourth Sundays in August.

Debbie Lammle reported that there will be two students continuing their second year of confirmation instruction - Will Delaney and Mitchell Gallier. Pastor McPike will meet with the class once a month after church.

Sunday School Superintendent's Report:

Connie Warsaw reported that the VBS was a huge success this past summer.

Old Business:

Chairman Hardesty informed the council that Lee Whitehouse confirmed that running the fans continually lowers the temperatures in the church.

Lee Whitehouse installed combination locks on the back door of the church and side door of the fellowship hall. A verbal announcement of the code to unlock the doors will be made multiple times during church. An announcement will be placed in the bulletin to call a council member anytime you forget the code and are unable to enter the buildings. (Labeled keys are located in the same place as before) Bob Zimmerman will look into keying all three doors the same

Chairman Hardesty thanked Bob Zimmerman for running the microphone wiring and placing a shelf in the sacristy off the pastor's office. Discussion was held about the need for a higher quality receiver. Glass instead of plastic inserts is now being used in the eternal flame. A possible oil filled eternal flame candle might be considered and purchased from memorial money

Discussion was held concerning hiring an electrician to make sure all devices in the church and fellowship hall are grounded appropriately.

Dick Johnson completed the balcony trim around the lights. Discussion was held concerning a new wheel chair ramp for the east door to the annex. Further discussion included extending the deck on the ramp and an electric door opener. Sidewalk replacement was also mentioned.

Chairman Hardesty asked for an update on the plans

for the upcoming church picnic. Debbie Lammle reported that all details were covered by the Ladies Aid.

The possible 125th Centennial Celebration was then discussed. It was suggested that three members be involved on the Steering Committee, with the Church Council in control of the entire event. Discussion followed with ideas for possible steering committee members.

Connie Warsaw suggested getting a baby gift for our organist, Alicia Haggin. The council approved the idea. Connie Warsaw was asked to purchase the gift card. Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
