Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman Council Meeting-April 6, 2016

The Immanuel Lutheran church of Osman held their monthly Council meeting on April 6, 2016 with eight members present. Those attending were John Lammle, Aaron Warsaw, Don Warsaw, Bob Zimmerman, Diana Zimmerman, Shirley Sprau, Lee Whitehouse, Debbie Lammle, and Pastor McPike. Chairman Lammle called the meeting to order, followed by prayer by Pastor McPike. Secretary, Debbie Lammle, read the minutes of the last meeting. Minutes were approved as amended.

Pastor's Report: Pastor McPike reminded the council that confirmation would be held on April 17th. Pastor also stated that the three evenings of questioning during Midweek Lenten Service went very well. This was a long time wish of Pastor's and allowed the questions to be narrowed down for each chief part, with greater opportunity for the confirmands to study in depth. The summer vicar's schedule is finalized. Vicar Johnston will arrive on May 23rd and will attend military training from May 31-June 14, as well as drill weekends on July 6-7 and August 6-7. Chairman Lammle researched housing in Fisher and contacted two different property owners. A studio apartment was available for \$200/month. Pastor McPike thought this would be adequate for the vicar's needs, but will confirm with the Vicar on specific furniture needs. Vicar Johnston is from California, has three older brothers, and is now attending Ft. Wayne Seminary. He completed an internship at Trinity Lutheran Church of Urbana as their Director of Christian Education. Pastor Strom, the pastor at Trinity, recommended Vicar Johnston highly.

The dedication for the new lawn mower, purchased with memorial money from the Leona Albin trust, will be held on Sunday April 10th. Training on the use of the mower will be given by Don Warsaw, and helpful operational hints will be posted on the mower. Discussion continued concerning

advertising future Holy Week services in a brochure that would be passed out in surrounding communities.

Bob Zimmerman gave the treasurer's report with a balance of \$80,727.22. Motion passed to approve the report. Treasurer Zimmerman reported that windows in the balcony were being replaced with stain glass using the Paul Zimmerman memorial monies. The baptism and communion theme will be continued.

Chairman Lammle commented on the good job as well as professional dress of the elders. Pastor stated their appearance signifies the importance of the special meal they are serving. Since the previous brochure for Immanuel Osman is no longer available, a new one will need to be compiled. New member reception with a BBQ cook off for the men and chili cook off for the women will be held in July. This is targeted to the sub 40 members in our church.

Sunday School Superintendent, Connie Warsaw, will be contacting parents about VBS.

Trustees Report: Lee Whitehouse stated that an audit of the church property and buildings were completed. He also obtained a second bid for the bell tower repair from McKumsey in the amount of \$1500. A motion was passed to present the two bids at the Voter's Meeting. A mowing list will be posted on the bulletin board in the church. Discussion then continued concerning the type of material (aluminum, wood, or concrete) for the new outside ramp east of the annex. Lee Whitehouse stated prices on aluminum ramp kits in the amount of approximately \$6000. Bob Zimmerman will get a bid on a concrete ramp as well as a separate bid on sidewalks to the east and north of the church.

Chairman Lammle compiled a Handyman List to be posted in the church. He also met with Waggoners, Inc. to match the fabric needed to repair the two church pews in the sanctuary. The factory representative is checking with the home office to find a match. It was recommended that movement of the pews be discussed after fabric availability is determined.

The Pastor's Circuit Meeting will be held at Immanuel Osman on May $10^{\rm th}$. Coffee and rolls in the morning, and lunch will be served by the LWML. Communion service will be held in the church. A Vicar welcome will be held June $19^{\rm th}$ with coffee and donuts before church.

Chairman Lammle went over the tentative list of activities for the rest of the year. They are as follows: Confirmation Reception-May 1st; Pastor's Circuit Meeting-May 10th; Ladies Night Out-June 10th; VBS-June 20-24th; Bring a Friend Night/Men's BBQ cook off/Ladies Chili cook off in July; Church Picnic-August 14; Hay Ride/Wiener Roast-Sept. 25, Pastor Appreciation/Reformation Fest; Youth Harvest Breakfast; Thanksgiving Potluck-Nov. 20th; Christmas Eve Children's Program-Dec. 24th; Christmas Morning Service-Dec. 25th. Chairman Lammle will research the use of the community building in Fisher for the church picnic.

Chairman Lammle then referred to the motion made by Shane Zimmerman to resolve the issue of "Choice Dollars" by the next Voter's Meeting-April 10th. He presented a second proposal which directed 50% to Youth Activities such as the LCMS Youth Gatherings and possible mission trips and 50% to adult and "sub 40 adult" projects, which includes church member assistance, non-member charitable benefits, and education and training for sub 40 adults. This training might include a retirement seminar or a Dave Ramsey class on budgeting. Remaining year-end balance would be directed into the organ fund. Chairman Lammle suggested a Stewardship Committee composed of Brenda Hendricks, Terri & Dwight Hooker, Steve & Marsha Warsaw, and Roy & Annette Whitehouse to help fulfill the objectives of this committee. A suggestion was made and agreed upon to omit the percentages from the policy. A motion was made by Diana Zimmerman and seconded by Shirley Sprau to accept the proposal for Thrivent Choice Dollars, without the percentages. Motion carried. Discussion was then held on having greeters during Sunday morning services. No decision was made. Discussion was held on advertisement for our church in local papers. The cost for advertising in the Mahomet Citizen, LeRoy/FC Press, Journal Republican, and Rantoul Press for a year was estimated under budget. (Due to the cost, the News Gazette will not be used) It was suggested that one Centennial Committee stay the same for the entire time of planning, instead of changing each year. Chairman Lammle suggested adding new church signs on RT 136 and 150, as well as updating the current signs. He stated the new signs use a different color for the LCMS emblem. It was suggested to keep the old signs, but add two new ones. It was also mentioned that we need a sign in Mansfield as well. No final motion was made.

Chairman Lammle then showed the latest web site done by Cybernautic, a design firm from Champaign. An estimated cost of \$5000 was quoted to update our church web site. By improving our web site, our congregation as well as people new to the community will be better informed as to what our church has to offer. Chairman Lammle will set up a meeting with the web designer, Pastor McPike, and himself for the coming week. Discussion continued on the functional use of our current web page for sermon files, bulletins, and newsletters thanks to Pastor McPike. Chairman Lammle stated that Immanuel Osman is on the Fisher web site, and has asked to be placed on the

Mahomet and Gibson City sites as well. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

A motion was made and seconded that we have Greeters at church each Sunday morning. A sign-up was passed around that will be posted on the bulletin board in the church.


The meeting ended with singing, prayers, and refreshments.
