Dear Ladies Aid and church members,

I wanted to thank everyone for all the goodies and items from my care package. I will definitely use all the items I received. It really means a lot to me that church members take time out of their busy day to write letters to me and send care packages. It is a great feeling to be a part of a close and caring church family that we have at Osman. Please pass along to the members that I apologize for not replying back to a lot of the letters, but my schedule has been changing a lot these past few months. Hopefully my work schedule gets more stable soon, and I can respond back to everyone.

Just a little update on my deployment life here in Afghanistan. The weather is very similar to Illinois weather. One day it is sunny and nice, the next it is rainy and nasty out. I would say the temperatures are very close as well. It is just not as humid. The city of Kabul that I am in, is bigger than Chicago. Traffic here is horrible, worse than Chicago traffic. There are no rules of the road here and drivers typically do whatever they want, like drive down the wrong way of traffic. My job here is transportation protection team so I drive in the mess every day. Luckily my truck has lights and sirens like a police car so it helps sometimes. I have learned to drive a stick shift very well here and how to be a very aggressive driver.

The base I am stationed on is considered a NATO base. There are 25 different countries stationed here as well.

I have been trying to learn a little of the different languages so I can understand what people are saying. There are a lot of extra events that take place on base. I joined the Cigar Club on base. It is a good way to meet different people and members from the U. S. Embassy side. I go play Bingo every other week. I won my first time going and have not won again. In my spare time, I find myself running a lot. I have run in two races already, a 5K and a 10K. I am trying to work up to a half marathon before I leave. If I am not running in my spare time, I watch a lot of movies. They have a community network drive that we can choose from hundreds of different movies to watch.

Being on a base with a lot of different countries here, there are a lot of important people that visit. I had the honor of meeting with our Secretary of State, John Kerry. He came to visit the troops here on base, and I was one of the six selected from my company to meet him. I was pretty nervous, but he was a very nice and professional person. We have had different presidents and prime ministers from different countries come here to visit. I have also had to transport some of them around the city.

I hope this is a little insight into my life so far on this deployment. I will write again and keep everyone updated. My time here so far is moving pretty fast, and I hope it continues to do so. I cannot wait to be back home and see everyone again. I hope everyone is doing well and is in good health. I look forward each week to getting my bulletin and CD. Thanks again for all of the letters, care packages, and prayers. Also thanks for keeping my parents busy and helping them through this deployment.

Church Council

Council Meeting-May 4, 2016

The monthly Church Council meeting of Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman was held on May 4, 2016, with eight members present. Those attending were John Lammle, Shane Zimmerman, Don Warsaw, Bob Zimmerman, Diana Zimmerman, John Gercken, Deb Lammle, Connie Warsaw, and Pastor McPike. Before opening the meeting, Kyle Simpson and Trent Swift, two representatives from Country Financial, reviewed our insurance policies for the church. The Commercial Account Summary form was reviewed. They recommended minor changes for cost savings which the council will review later.

The meeting was then opened by Chairman Lammle. Pastor gave devotion from the Gospel for Ascension Sunday and prayer. The secretary read the minutes of the last meeting. Motion to approve was made by Don Warsaw and seconded by Shane Zimmerman. Motion carried. The last voter's meeting minutes from April 10th were reviewed with one correction on the date of the presentation of the new mower.

Pastor's report: Pastor McPike thanked everyone who helped with the Bryon Christian's funeral and dinner following. He announced that Vicar Johnston will arrive May 23rd, and was very satisfied with a studio apartment. Pastor's circuit meeting will be on May 10th at Immanuel Osman with a 9:30am Eight pastors are expected. communion service. Monthly communion will be changed in July from July 3rd to July 10th. Pastor McPike stated that Annette Warsaw expressed an interest in helping improve the church website. She provided samples from other sites she maintains. These sites use the "WordPress" platform. Pastor McPike investigated and found that WordPress is freely available and can be downloaded and installed on the present Osman website, and will continue communicating with Annette to improve the site. Pastor stated that his daughter Sara has been accepted into the Deaconess Program in Concordia Lutheran School for the coming year. Congratulations Sara!

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Bob Zimmerman read the treasurer's report with a balance of \$79,668.76. Connie Warsaw made the motion to accept; John Gercken seconded; motion carried.

A slight increase in attendance for Sunday morning worship was reported by Chairman Lammle.

Sunday School Superintendent's Report: Connie Warsaw requested the amount budgeted for VBS. The treasurer stated that \$650 was budgeted plus an additional check donated in the amount of \$240 could be used for this purpose. Connie then reported that VBS would be held June 20-24th from 8:30-11am. She had been in contact with Vicar Johnston, who will be teaching Grades 2 through 5. She had advertised in local papers and distributed posters in local communities. A coffee hour at 9am in the Fellowship Hall and closing program will be held on June 26th.

Trustees Report: It was reported that the air conditioners had been serviced as per annual contracted agreement. Shane Zimmerman stated he would program the air conditioner thermostats for the summer. Bob Zimmerman then reported that Steve Windle Concrete gave a quote of \$7062 for the construction of the new concrete ramp (with rebar) and sidewalks. This quote also includes hauling away of existing ramp and sidewalk. The cost of railing was not included in the estimate. Larry Lutz's name was mentioned as knowing someone who could provide an estimate on railing. It was reported that the handicapped parking signs were relocated to the west side of the church. Chairman Lammle stated that Waggoners, Inc. were unable to find a match for our current fabric on our pews; another source will be contacted.

Chairman Lammle reviewed the upcoming activities for the year. Those included in May and June are the Pastor's Circuit Meeting on May 10th, Girls Night Out-June 10th, Vicar Welcome-June 19th, and Vacation Bible School-June 20-24th. Chairman Lammle then read the list of sub forty adults to be invited to the Chili cook-off for the ladies and BBQ cook-off for the men. This activity would also be advertised as a "bring a friend" event. Diana Zimmerman made a motion to send invitations to the suggested list; John Gercken seconded; motion carried. July 23rd was set as the date for this event. (This activity will be funded from the Events Committee budget.) In the invitation the ladies participating in the cook-off will be asked to bring their recipe for chili; the meat and grills will be provided for the men participating in the contest. Chairman Lammle then stated that the Fisher Community building was available for the annual church picnic at a cost of \$150 plus a \$200 deposit which will be returned if the building is left how it was found. Pastor McPike thought it was a favorable idea to include all surrounding communities when planning the annual picnic. John Gercken made a motion to hold the 2016 church picnic at Fisher Community building. Shane Zimmerman seconded; motion carried.

Chairman Lammle recommended the purchase of 2 directional signs-one on RT 136 at 400E/2900N and one on RT 150 (Champaign & Piatt County Line) and the removal of the old sign at the corner of RT 136&47. The cost per sign through Concordia Publishing House is \$152 each for double sided. LCMS approved logo is either in blue or black shades. The council suggested the purchase of the blue logo. Chairman Lammle requested a second council member to confirm mileage on signs prior to placing the order, and will obtain ILDOT approval to install prior to ordering.

From one of the new member surveys, it was suggested that we have greeters before Sunday morning worship. The Ladies Aid offered to serve in this capacity during the months of June through August. It was reported that the 125th Anniversary committee met and submitted a list of suggestions to Chairman Lammle for review. This list will be sent to council members before the next Council meeting. Chairman Lammle stated that the Confirmation Reception went well and was greatly appreciated by all. It was recommended that our church continue with 50th anniversary confirmation class recognition as we lead up to our 125th Anniversary Celebration. Further suggestion included recognizing senior members in our congregation.

Chairman Lammle presented a request from Brenda Hendricks to purchase six additional bells from the Norma Homann memorial funds. Chairman Lammle reviewed the request with Music Director, Alicia Haggin, who agreed with the request. Zimmerman made a motion to purchase the bells from the Norma Homann memorial; Connie Warsaw seconded; motion carried. The second request from Thrivent advocates was for \$1000 for a second benefit soup supper. After much discussion, it was agreed that this type of request should be submitted by the Stewardship Committee under the guidelines of the Thrivent Policy and Procedure of Thrivent Choice dollars as approved by the voters. Chairman Lammle will contact the Stewardship Committee for further clarification of their job description and invite them to the next meeting. Don Warsaw made a motion to deny the Thrivent advocate request of \$1000 for a benefit; Bob Zimmerman seconded; motion carried. Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
