Faces of the Reformation


In just about one year, October 31, 2017, will mark the 500th Anniversary of the posting of "A Disputation on the Power of Indulgences" - what we have known for many years as the "95 Theses". They were penned by Martin Luther, professor of Theology at the University of Wittenberg, as a proposition for debate on the university level. They were posted on the door of the so-called "Castle Church", which, since 1499 had functioned as a chapel for the newly founded University of Wittenberg. The reason for posting them on October 31 is that it was the "Eve of All Hallows" or All Saints' Day, which is where "Halloween" comes from. November 1 being a high festival day, many would be coming for Mass, and it was common for propositions for debate to be posted, in Latin, for university students and professors to read, consider, and debate. Luther did not intend for these theses to be widely published. Had that been his intention, he'd have posted them in German on the doors of St. Mary's Church, the church in the center of town just off the main town square (Stadtplatz). However, sentiment against hierarchy on the church level as well as in the political arena were running high, and soon Luther's 95 Theses were translated into German and published far and wide. The result was a

long struggle that ended in the established church fracturing, and is looked to as the origins of what we know today as the "Lutheran Church."

For the coming year, we will mark this 500th Anniversary

in a variety of ways. One of those ways will be to make use of a resource from the LCMS called "Faces of the Reformation."

These will include bulletin inserts as well as single Bible Studies that will be used on Sunday morning. There are not enough of these studies to fill all the Sundays from now through next October. A schedule has been



devised to make use of them, however, and the next month will feature the following:

October 31 – Junker Jorg (Knight George, which was Luther's disguise when he lived at Wartburg Castle in 1519-1520).

November 6 – Philipp Melanchthon – Luther's "right hand man" - professor of languages at Wittenberg

November 13 – Martin Luther (early years)

November 20 – Katharina von Bora – the ex-nun who married Luther.

After that, we will pick back up with the Revelation study until after the first of the year.

Additionally, special celebrations will be held. Stay tuned for further details!

Church Council Minutes

Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman Council Minutes

September 7, 2016

The Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman Church Council held its monthly meeting on September 7, 2016, with eleven members present. Those attending were John Lammle, Shane Zimmerman, Aaron Warsaw, Don Warsaw, Lee Whitehouse, John Gercken, Deb Lammle, Connie Warsaw, Diana Zimmerman, Shirley Sprau, and Pastor McPike. Pastor McPike opened the meeting with prayer. The secretary's minutes were read and approved. In Bob Zimmerman's absence, Chairman Lammle gave the treasurer's report with a balance of \$67, 348. 93. Shane Zimmerman made a motion to accept the report. John Gercken seconded, and the motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor McPike complimented the Vicar on a job well done and stated that Vicar was happy to serve at Osman as well. Pastor informed the council that he would be attending a Chaplain Gathering in Belleville during the third Sunday in September. He would also be gone one Sunday in October and one Sunday in November. Pastor Ehlers will continue filling in during the Sundays Pastor McPike is gone. Reverend James Bloch and his wife transferred from Trinity Danville to Immanuel Osman. They are living at Bridle Brook in Mahomet, and will be on the shut-in list at Immanuel Osman. Rev. Bloch served at the Mahomet Mission Church and in Ontario, Canada.

The 500th Anniversary of the Reformation will be the topic for the Bible Study during adult Sunday School in October. All are encouraged to attend! Pastor informed the council that lightening damaged the internet at the church, and we lost the router and camera on the hall. The router was replaced and discussion was held on replacing the outside camera. John Gercken made the motion to replace the outside video camera. Lee Whitehouse seconded, and the motion carried. A black robe was ordered as a thank you gift for Vicar Johnston from the congregation. The gift arrived in time for Vicar Johnston to take with him to Ft. Wayne.

<u>Sunday School Superintendent Report:</u> Connie Warsaw stated that September 11th would be Christian Education Sunday. Donuts and drinks will be served in the hall at 9 a.m. The children will play the bells and sing a special song during the service. Joy Johnson will

continue teaching the high school class. Pastor McPike informed the council that the Sunday School class would soon begin confirmation memory work.

<u>Trustees Report:</u> Lee Whitehouse stated he removed the mold off the north end of the hall and still had painting projects pending. Discussion continued concerning the quotes on the new ramp project off the east side of the annex. Lee Whitehouse stated he would get a quote for a railing on the ramp by September 18th, when a special council meeting would be held after church. Chairman Lammle also asked that both quotes for the concrete ramp cover the same materials and dimensions.

2016 Church Activities: Chairman Lammle went over the list of items needed for the upcoming hay ride/wiener roast on September 25th beginning at 4:30 p.m. Hay rack and truck will be brought by Aaron Warsaw and John Lammle; council will set up and decorate on September 24th at 9 a.m.; sign-up sheet, meat/buns/condiments by Debbie Lammle; drinks by Diana Zimmerman and Shirley Sprau; ingredients for s'mores by Shirley Sprau; grilling the meat by Aaron Warsaw; sticks for roasting by Aaron Warsaw & Lee Whitehouse; children games and adult activity by Shirley Sprau and Debbie Lammle; and fire wood by Lee Assignments for Whitehouse. the Appreciation/Reformation Fest were also discussed. Pastor & Larry Lutz will make German pancakes; Debbie Lammle will post sign-up sheet and bring German potato salad and apple strudel; John Lammle will grill the meat; Darryl Redding will bring sauerkraut; those members attending will be asked to bring dishes to compliment the meal. A free will offering will be taken during the event to assist in the cost of the band. Activities for the event include Reformation skit, polka band, and possible trivia games. The remaining activities for the rest of the year were reviewed. It was decided that on Christmas morning a hymn sing would begin at 9:30 a.m. with the church service beginning at 10 a.m.

Old Business: Chairman Lammle stated that approval was received from the state to place the Immanuel Lutheran church sign on Rt. 47. He is ordering the signs tomorrow, securing the posts, and making the brackets. No response has been received from the Marvin Nelson family. A personal parking sign for senior member, Jeri Bidner, was ordered and received. The sign will be presented at the Weiner Roast/Hay Ride on September 25th. Chairman Lammle then referred to the nominating committee draft and asked for any other nominees for

the ballot for the upcoming election. He tabled the issue concerning "a quorum for meetings". He recommended not making changes till the Constitutional Review Committee has a chance to review changes in the Web version of the constitution and verify documented changes made with voter approval. Discussion continued concerning "quorum" wording in both documents of the constitution. Chairman Lammle presented draft forms to document pay for church employees, and will ask treasurer, Bob Zimmerman, to complete the pay information. The council was informed that the Vicar's salary and Pastor McPike's salary combined equals the synod's current suggested salary for a one year pastor.

The council was informed that the church phone was not working and Frontier was called for repair. Chairman Lammle then read a letter of resignation from Church Treasurer, Bob Zimmerman. Accompanying the letter was a check for \$300 for the prior use of the church tables. In the letter, Bob stated he would help train the new treasurer.

Chairman Lammle stated he would not be available for the next council and voters' meeting. Lee Whitehouse made a motion to move the next council meeting to October 12th and voters' meeting to October 16th to allow Chairman Lammle to be present. Aaron Warsaw seconded the motion, and the motion carried. John Gercken made the motion to adjourn. Shirley Sprau seconded, and the motion carried. Meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Quarterly Voters' Meeting

Voters' Meeting-July 10, 2016

The Quarter Voters' meeting at Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman was held on July 10th with 30 members present. Chairman Lammle asked Pastor McPike to open the meeting with prayer. The secretary's minutes were read and approved. Treasurer, Bob Zimmerman, read his report with a balance of \$74,847.26. Butch Sprau made a motion to accept the report. Ken Whitehouse seconded, and the motion carried. Treasurer Zimmerman thanked all the members of the congregation for their generous offerings. The first six months were right on budget, although expenses were somewhat higher due to the insurance bill being paid all in one payment.

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: Pastor McPike thanked the members for his partnership with Immanuel. He read a letter from member, Susan Miller. Susan would like to give back to the church by going through training to become a Parish Nurse. Insurance for this position is carried by Carle. Pastor McPike will be writing a letter of recommendation.

<u>Sunday School Superintendent Report:</u> Connie Warsaw then gave a report on the VBS program held at Osman this past June. A slide show was presented on June 26th during a coffee hour before church. The students sang songs and played the bells during the program. Pastor thanked Connie and those involved for a job well done!

New Business: Chairman Lammle informed the members that a Stewardship Committee has been formed to coordinate and plan the use of Thrivent Choice Funds received each year, under the direction of the council for religious, charitable, and educational purposes. Chairman Lammle thanked the Ladies Aid members for being church greeters through August. He went over the future church activities for the year. Church Picnic-August 14th in the Fisher Community Center; Hay Ride/Wiener Roast-September 25; Pastor Appreciation/Reformation Fest-October 30th; Youth Harvest Breakfast TBA; Thanksgiving Dinner & Service-November 20th; Christmas Eve Children's Service-December 24th; and Christmas Morning Service-December 25th.

Advent Service

Advent is a time of expectation and preparation. Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day. This year Advent begins on November 27th. Advent means "coming" and is a time of preparation, anticipation, and expectation of Christmas, where we celebrate that Jesus, God's son, was born into our world. The liturgical color of advent is purple, which symbolizes penitence and preparation. The 1st Sunday of advent is a holy day that marks the beginning of a new church year. Many churches, ours included, have adopted the tradition of using the Advent wreath. The wreath holds three purple candles and one pink. The purple candles match the paraments on the altar. Later, the blue candles replaced the purple ones to match the new blue paraments. The pink candle was the third candle to be lit on Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent. "Gaudete" means "Rejoice" in Latin. Hence a "pink" candle was used to signify "rejoicing". A "Christ Candle" in the middle of the wreath is lit during the 12 days of Christmas. (December 25-Jan. 5)

Immanuel Osman will celebrate Advent with an Advent Service and Social Hour following on November 30th at 7 p.m. Mark your calendars now for this special celebration!

Daylight Savings Time ends at 2 a.m. on Sunday, November 6th so remember to turn your clocks **BACK** one hour on Saturday night!

Other items discussed:


- (1) The members voted to buy a LWML Zone President's pin from the zone treasury for the next president.

- (7) Danville Zone is assigned articles in the Clarion for the Spring Issue (deadline April 25) Articles may be submitted anytime.
- (8) The CID convention will be held at Altamont, with Friday night events at St. Paul's New Pointe. The theme is "Grow and Build Together in Love".
- (9) Registration forms for 2017 National Convention will be in Winter Quarterly. Lois Wood from Thomasboro will be the National delegate from our zone.

- (10) Spring Gathering will be planned by Cissna, Milford, and Watseka. A collection will be taken for our zone treasury at the gathering.
- (11) It was voted that the zone project for this year will be supporting the Seek and Find Ministry in Rantoul with new or gently used Christmas toys. These toys may be given to Debbie Lammle or brought to the Christmas Luncheon on December 9th at the Paxton Tea Room. Toys are sold at Seek and Find year around, but for the toy drive, the store prefers the items by December 17th at noon.
- (12)The 2017 zone project was also voted on. It will be a monetary gift that would be divided equally among the Lutheran Schools in the Zone to be used toward tuition expense of one or more children. This project will be turned in at the 2017 October president's meeting.
