Church Council

Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman Voter's Meeting – October 22, 2017

The Quarterly Voter's Meeting was called to order by Chairman John Lammle on October 22, 2017. Pastor McPike opened the meeting with prayer. The secretary, Sandy Whitehouse, read the minutes of the July Voter's meeting. Minor corrections were made. Roy Whitehouse made the motion to accept the minutes; Ken Whitehouse seconded; motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Treasurer, Bob Zimmerman, read the 3rd quarter balance with a total of \$61,377.03. Bob reviewed the third quarter's totals for each category and stated we are well on track to what has been budgeted for, however offerings are down year to date. Darwin Warsaw made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report; Rick Hardesty seconded; motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor McPike thanked the congregation for the continued support and partnership he receives in ministry. Pastor will be out of the country on November 5-13. Pastor Ehlers will be available. On November 12, Pastor Bob Frank will be leading the Ministry. Reformation Fest is October 29. All Saints will be observed on November 5 and we'll continue this tradition on the first Sunday of November each year. We will remember the Saints on Earth and those who have gone before us. There will be a single toll of the bell for each deceased member. We will start with 2008, the first year Pastor was at Immanuel Lutheran of Osman.

Pastor also stated that he has refurbished the existing computer which should get us by for a while.

<u>Sunday School Superintendent's Report</u>: Nothing to report. <u>Trustee Report</u>:

- The ramp project is almost finished. The Council has approved a permanent railing, which would be completed soon and will allow us to stay within budget.
- We are looking into possible replacement of the ceiling fans for 2018.

Treasurer's Report:

• The November 30, 2017 balance was \$58,233.38. Shirley Sprau made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report; Don Warsaw seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor Report:

- Christmas services will be held on December 24 at 9:30am, 4th Sunday of Advent and the Christmas Eve services will be held at 7:00pm that same evening which will include the Children's Program. Thank you to Annette Warsaw for putting the Children's program skit together.
- We will remove the Christmas decorations after service on Jan. 7, which is the Epiphany.
- We will be seeing Pastor Curtis Beltman perform an upcoming service at our church. Pastor Beltman is the Circuit Pastor, and he visits all the churches in his circuit. Pastor McPike will likely swap services with him that same Sunday. Pastor Beltman is from Monticello. Date is to be determined.
- Wheelchair Ramp and Doors dedication will be completed on December 31. Letters have been mailed to families of all whose memorial funds were used to help fund the project.

• Deputy Brian Hanner with the McLean County Sheriff's office visited to talk with the Council about church security. Deputy Hanner informed the Council the side door of the church needs a better lock and seal. He reported he routinely checks the doors on the church and Hall and everything else is very secure. As far as church disturbances, the likelihood is very low. Typically, if there are issues, it's related to domestic, issues within a person's life, or mental illness. Our best protection is to be on the lookout for any symptoms or warnings of any of this happening and to let each other

know. We do have options — we can lock the doors during the services. Conceal & Carry is an option, but that would be up to the Church, but strongly suggest taking extra training to do so. It was noted that a few churches in Bloomington have security detail as one of the duties in the church.

- Chairman Lammle plans to attend a Church Security Seminar "How Can You Keep Your Church Safe?", sponsored by the DeWitt County Sheriff's Department and hosted at the Clinton First Christian Church in Clinton, IL on Tuesday, January 9th. Others are welcome to attend as well.
- While researching the Texas church shooting, Chairman Lammle noticed a story about Rylan Ward, a 5-year-old who was shot 5 times during the shooting. His stepmother and 2 sisters were among those killed. Ryland will not be home for Christmas but wished to have people send him Christmas cards with a photo of their pets and it was suggested to send \$1 to help with ongoing expenses. We decided this would be a considerate act for our congregation to take. Pastor will email everyone the next day with the request and the address.
- New Secretary Chair Due to safety concerns, it was decided we needed to purchase a new chair for Linda. Chairman Lammle found a chair on sale for \$271.24. Bob Zimmerman made a motion to approve the purchase; Shirley Sprau seconded; motion carried.
- 2018 Budget: Bob Zimmerman reviewed the proposed plans for the 2018 budget. After reviewing the line item amounts, it was agreed to a budget of \$120,465, which is approximately \$16,000 less than 2017. The budget detail will be presented to the Voter's at the Annual meeting. Don Warsaw motioned to approve the proposed budget, Dave Kunde seconded. Motion carried.

- 12. Enact family meal time.
- 13. Banish brown bag boredom. Try easy-to-fix, healthy ideas.
- 14. Explore new foods and flavors.
- 15. Eat seafood twice a week.
- 16. Cut back on added sugars.
- 17. Experiment with more plant-based meals.
- 18. Make an effort to reduce food waste. Check what foods you have on hand before stocking up at the store. Plan meals based on leftovers. Buy only what you will use or freeze within a couple of days.
