## Monthly Hymn Sing begins in June

#### From Pastor McPike's Desk...

The choice of music in worship services can be more contentious than many think. We all enjoy familiar music, favorite hymns, etc. Often, it could be said that those discussing the service they just attended over a Sunday midday meal speak more favorably of the service when they liked the music and less favorably (or even disdainfully) when music has been less familiar.

There is a particular theme to each worship service. The theme is set by the "propers", or those things that are "proper" to be done for that particular Sunday. These include the three Scripture lessons read in the service, as well as elements like the Introit, Collect, Gradual, etc., that are usually made available to us by the weekly bulletin inserts from CPH. I have a book that suggests hymns for each Sunday and service of the church year based on how those hymns support the particular theme of the day.

What makes a good hymn? There are both objective and subjective elements to answer that question. Subjectively, familiarity and "sound" of the hymn figure high in the minds of many. Objectively, the theological content of the words, a "good wedding of text and tune" (meaning that the melody or tune is supportive of the words of the hymn). As an example of the difference the tune can make, consider many people's favorite "Amazing Grace". First of all, if you hear the melody without the words, you can almost "hear the words" before the singing starts. Also, the melody very well supports the message being conveyed – the wonder of God's Amazing Grace. Those same words, however, fit the tune of the theme-song of a 1960s TV sitcom "Gilligan's Island". Try it sometime... it is probably the best illustration I can think of where a tune can ruin wonderful words!

When I choose hymns, I follow several criteria. One, I try to choose hymns that support or agree with the theme of the

service for that day. Usually we don't sing Christmas hymns on Easter or Pentecost Hymns at Christmastime. The next thing I follow is not singing any particular hymn too often. There are over 500 hymns in Lutheran Service Book, and singing just a few would do dis-service to the many rich hymns included in the book. (Exceptions to that are hymns made to replace parts of the liturgy, such as "We Praise You and Acknowledge You", LSB 941, which is written as a more modern presentation of the ancient Matins chant known as the Te Deum Laudamus.) Another thing I follow is, there is one hymn appointed for each service called the Hymn of the Day (in German, Hauptlied). I try to use that, unless it is so hard to sing it would just not work out. I do rate hymns according to how easy or hard they are to sing, and try not to choose more than one rather difficult hymn in any given service. You have also probably noticed that when a hymn is not so familiar, or when it is long, I will sing major portions myself or have the Choir support it so that it is not tedious. In other words, I don't deliberately choose hymns that are not familiar or too hard to sing, though I'm sure that I don't please all the people all the time.

The words of hymns are as important, if not more important, to me. The theology they present is a key element. Hymns are important teaching tools. Luther said, "Why should the devil get all the good tunes?" He was talking about how tunes can teach us and remind us of things. When you hear the tune to "A Mighty Fortress" - you think of Luther and the Reformation. When you hear music traditionally used at weddings, you think of a wedding. Words make a huge difference. Many older Lutheran hymns are written to convey a specific message of theology. Luther's "Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice" and Paul Speratus' "Salvation unto us has come" tell the entire story of salvation in ten stanzas. Luther wrote a hymn for each chief part of the catechism, so that the concepts could be learned by music as well as teaching.

On now to why the title probably caught your eye. Hymn sing! This summer, we are going to take the first 10 or so minutes of one non-communion service each month and,

instead of an opening hymn, we will take requests from the congregation. This should add a little variety to our program and allow people to occasionally sing hymns that they would like. The only caveat is, they must be hymns in our current hymnal. Music that is not in the hymnal is tricky copyright-wise. (Yes, sadly, churches are often the worst offenders when it comes to breaking copyright laws by carelessly producing copyrighted music and other materials without permission). The Sunday that we plan to start this is the fourth Sunday of June.

#### **Stock Your Emergency Kit Now**

Your home emergency kit should be accessible and contain:

- Food and water for each family member for 3 days as well as a can opener and nonperishable foods, such as tuna and peanut butter.
- Pet food, water, cat litter for 3 days
- Hand crank or battery-powered flashlight and radio with extra batteries.
- Full first aid kit, including hand sanitizer and garbage bags.
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape for broken windows or leaky roof
- Whistle to signal for help so rescuers can locate you.
- Remember to grab medications to take to your shelter

Your car emergency kit should contain:

- A properly inflated spare tire, wheel wrench, tripod jack, and jumper cables
- A tool kit, compass, duct tape and car charger for your cell phone
- A flashlight with extra batteries, rain poncho and a fire extinguisher
- Reflective triangles and vest, and brightly colored cloth to make your vehicle more visible
- A first aid kit and enough nonperishable food and water for 3 days
- Blanket

Emergency situations can happen any time, making it crucial that you are prepared for the unexpected long before it happens.

## LWML - CID 73<sup>rd</sup> Annual Convention

The LWML-CID 73<sup>rd</sup> annual convention was held on April 28<sup>th</sup> at Trinity Lutheran Church, Bloomington, with a theme "Look Up! Look In! Look Out! During the procession of banners, Marlene Schultz, Danville Zone LWML President, carried the Danville Zone banner, made by Calvary Watseka. The convention was opened by Sheila Lutz, LWML District President. The pledges were recited, followed by a welcome by the Bloomington Zone President. The bible study was given by Rev. Mark Peters, Senior District Counselor. Adoption of convention rules and agenda was given by Shelley Moeller. The convention speaker was Missionary Gary Thies, Director of Mission Central, the largest Mission Supporting Agency in the entire LCMS. At the present, this facility is operated by a total of 97 volunteers. 18 volunteer secretaries type in their homes, and 5 pilots donate their planes and their efforts to fly Gary to different locations. Gary has spoken in more than 1700 congregations in the US and Canada. Last year 118 missionaries and their families stayed overnight at Mission Central from all over the world. The convention offering was \$3838.31 and 291 were in attendance. Reports were given by the two YWR's who attended the National Convention in Albuquerque. The first sessions and business meetings were then conducted. Balloting was completed on new district officers and mission grants. After lunch a second special interest session was held followed by the afternoon business meeting. The LWML Song and pledge were recited. Greetings from Rev. Mark Miller, District President, were given. The Gifts from the Heart report was given by Laura Strattman, Human Care Chairman. There were 28 members who helped with off campus servant events on Friday, with 70 helping with servant events at the church. 130 bibles were marked, 21 quilts tied, 9 baby quilts completed, 165 t-shirts cut for layettes, 40 bags packed for Home Sweet Home, 240 boxes for Orphan Grain Train, \$470 collected for shipping costs, and \$1500 collected for Disaster Relief. Marlene Schultz invited the group to Danville for the next LWML-CID convention in 2019. Installation of officers was held, followed by the President's address by Sheila Lutz. Closing devotion and hymn ended the convention. Those attending from Immanuel Osman were Barb Gaines, Connie Warsaw, Brenda Hendricks, and Debbie Lammle.

The monthly council meeting of the Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman was held on April 18, 2018. The following members were present: Rick Hardesty, John Lammle, Dave Kunde, Steve Martin, Don Warsaw, Deb Lammle, Steve Warsaw and Sandy Whitehouse. Pastor opened the meeting with prayer. Sandy Whitehouse read the minutes from the March council meeting. Minor corrections were noted. Dave Kunde made a motion to accept the minutes; Don Warsaw seconded; Motion carried.

#### **Treasurer's Report**:

• The March 31, 2018 balance was \$60,083.10. John Lammle reviewed income and expenses for March. We have no changes to the Memorial Fund report from last month.
