Alcohol Awareness Month 2019

The 2019 theme, "Help for Today, Hope for Tomorrow," is designed to draw attention to the pervasive impact that alcohol, alcoholism, and alcohol-related problems have on young people, their friends, families, and communities. Also to highlight that help is available and recovery is possible. Excessive drinking is responsible for more than 4,300 deaths among underage youth each year. Alcohol is the most addictive substance in the United States. Youth who start drinking before age 15 are 4 times more likely to develop alcohol dependence than those who drink at age 21. Drinking by persons under the age of 21 is linked to 189,000 emergency room visits. Kids who drink are more likely to be victims of violent crimes, traffic crashes, and school related problems. Youth who have conversations with their parents and learn a lot about the dangers of alcohol and drug use are 50% less likely to use alcohol and drugs than those who don't have such conversations.

Alcohol Free Weekend

During Alcohol Free Weekend, (April 5-7), Facing Addiction with the National Council on Alcohol and Drug Dependence, (NCADD), extends an open invitation to all Americans to engage in 3 alcohol-free days. Those individuals or families who experience difficulty or discomfort in this 72-hour experiment are urged to contact local Facing Addiction with NCADD Affiliates Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) or Al-Anon to learn more about alcoholism and the early symptoms.
