# Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman Quarterly Voters meeting minutes April 28, 2019

Chairman Hardesty called the meeting to order at 10:40am and Pastor McPike said a prayer.

Chairman Hardesty then asked if anyone needed to sign the constitution with no one signing.

Secretary Hardesty read the minutes of the February Voters meeting. Seeing no additions or corrections, Theresa VanWakeman-Wilson made a motion to approve the minutes. 2<sup>nd</sup> by John Gercken. Motion carried.

Treasurer John Lammle gave the quarterly Treasurer's report with a balance of cash on hand as of 3/31/19 of \$60,426.76. A motion was made by Don Warsaw to approve the Treasurer's report. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Leonard Delaney. Motion carried.

#### Pastor's Report

Pastor McPike reported that has an 11 year partnership at Osman. He is not here the following Sunday, May 5th and Pastor Ehlers will be here that day and a seminary student, Chris Walters, will be preaching the sermon. Chris is the LWML's seminary student they are sponsoring and son in law of a former pastor at Osman, Pastor Henry. On Pentecost, Pastor will also not be present at Osman as he will be attending his former church, Grace Lutheran in Norfolk, NE and giving a sermon that day.

#### **Old Business**

The Youth Group was successful with the Easter breakfast, raising \$900 for their projects.

Chairman Hardesty discussed with the congregation that Blue Top Construction submitted a proposal for the cleaning of the church ceiling, small painting job and installation of commercial fans in the church, to help with humidity in the ceiling. They will begin on May 6<sup>th</sup>. They quoted a 1 week turn-around time and there might be a Sunday when we'd have to hold church in the hall. In further discussion, Chairman said the company is member, Mark Barrack. The cost of the bid was \$4,000. We could possibly use the building fund and emergency fund to pay for the work done. Don Warsaw also spoke to "we really don't know what

damage is in the ceiling until we see it more closely but something is definitely going on". Sue Van Wakeman also mentioned we might want to also clean the carpeting in the Sanctuary at the same time while the pews were out. The point was well taken. A motion was made by Larry Lutz and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Gus Warsaw to proceed the project. Motion carried. We also owe the cost of the fans to the contractor who has already purchased the equipment. A motion was made by Don Warsaw and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Theresa VanWakeman-Wilson to proceed with the payment to the contractor. Paint will be about \$320 to purchase 4 gallon and that was a donation.

#### **New Business**

Flowers and landscape work will begin May 5<sup>th</sup> by the youth of the church with Thrivent Choice Funds donated by Brenda Hendricks. She will coordinate times with the youth to help beautify the church area.

Barb Whitehouse Gercken added the thought of also removing the painting above the altar while painting will be going on. Discussion was held for both sides to remove or not to remove. No decision was made only discussion.

Chairman Hardesty asked for a motion to adjourn. Barb Whitehouse Gercken made a motion to adjourn, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jeff Warsaw. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer by all in attendance.

# CHURCH REPAIRS AND COMPLETION UPDATE

I just wanted to let everyone know about the update on the church sanctuary repairs that have now been completed:

- 1. Sunday May 6th, the church pews were moved to clear a path for the scaffolding could be set up in the church so repairs could be made to the ceiling.
- 2. Once started, we found more severe damage of the ceiling than what we had originally thought to be there. This was an excellent time to do the work. It was found that there was not any mold or fungus on the ceiling. The dark spots were found to be stained boards. The boards were in good shape. The boards were sanded to lighten and re-stained to match the original color and a finish was put over all of the precleaned boards.
- 3. Several of the boards that run down the center of the ceiling were found to be loose. Over time, the original fasteners had pulled loose and new screws were installed to re-secure the boards.
- 4. The front section near the speaker with the board pulled away the most was found to have not only the center board but the adjoining boards loose. New screws were replaced to secure all the boards. That was the worst section in the sanctuary.
- 5. We were in the Fellowship Hall until June 2nd. We returned to the church on Pentecost Sunday, June 9th. The church looked very nice with the red flowers in the front of the church.

We are so lucky to have such talented members of our congregation to assist and complete with projects of this sort. When phone calls are made for help, we thank you for taking time from your busy schedules for manpower.

Thank you to all involved with this project who helped in anyway. Also, thank you to Blue Top Construction, Mark Barrack. Your talents are greatly appreciated by all!

#### **Fireworks**

The American traditions of parades, cookouts, and fireworks help us celebrate our country's birthday and the summer season. However a celebration can turn into a painful memory when children and adults get injured or killed while using fireworks. Although legal fireworks comply with U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) regulation can be relatively safe when used responsibly, all fireworks, by their nature, are hazardous and can cause injuries. Some fireworks, such as illegal firecracker type devices (M-80s, quarter sticks), and professional display fireworks should never be handled by consumers, due to the risk of serious injury and death. Fireworks should only be used with extreme caution. Older children should be closely supervised and younger children should not be allowed to play with fireworks, including sparklers.

Before using fireworks, make sure they are permitted in your state or local area. Check with your local government, such as police or fire department, for detailed requirements. Mail-order make your own kits to build banned fireworks are prohibited by law.

To help consumers use fireworks more safely, the CPSC offers these recommendations:

- Do not allow young children to play with fireworks.
   Sparklers burn at very high temperatures and should not be allowed for young children to handle.
- Older children should be allowed to play with fireworks only under close adult supervision. Do not allow any horseplay or running.
- Set off fireworks in a clear area away from houses, dry leaves, or grass and other flammable materials.
- Keep a bucket of water nearby in case of emergencies for pouring on fireworks that fail to ignite or malfunction. Soak them then throw away.
- Be sure other people are out of range before lighting fireworks.
- Never light fireworks in a container, especially glass and metal.
- Keep unused fireworks away from firing area.
- Store fireworks in cool dry place.
- Check instructions for special storing directions.
- Observe local laws. Never have any portion of your body directly over the fireworks while lighting.
- Do not experiment with homemade fireworks.
