Covid Update

Seven ladies met on Thursday, November 11th for the Ladies Aid/LWML Meeting at 1:30 PM in the fellowship hall. After opening by singing "Now Thank We All Our God" the LWML pledge was recited. Marsha Warsaw gave the opening devotion. Marsha also gave the topic entitled "God Is Always With Us". Marsha Warsaw, secretary, read the minutes, and they were approved as read. Sue VanWakeman, treasurer, gave the treasurer's report with a balance as of October 31 as \$595.98. Treasurer's report was approved. The members were asked to pay their 2021 dues of \$17. Correspondence from the new adopted Seminary student, Jackson Scofield, was read by Brenda Hendricks. Wilma Grussing reported on the cards that she had sent in the last two months. Terri Hooker reported on delivering 18 boxes of quilts and 2 boxes of fabric kits to Flatville for Lutheran World Relief. 122 quilts were made by the ladies from October 2020 to October 2021. Diana Zimmerman reported that when there are 50 more pillowcase dresses completed, she will mail to Dresses for Africa.

Connie Warsaw reported on the Danville Zone LWML Rally which was held in Buckley on September 14th. Brenda Hendricks reported on the LWML CID retreat which was held on October 8 and 9 at Camp CILCA. Marsha Warsaw gave a report on the progress of Amelia Kirkpatrick who is part of our adopted family. With the new year approaching, there was a discussion of whether the group wanted to keep supporting Amelia and her mother, Abby, or find another needy family. The congregation will be asked for suggestions and further discussion will take place at the next meeting.

New business consisted of election of officers. Terri Hooker who was the nominating committee presented the ballot. The five offices were uncontested, so the following new officers were elected: President – Brenda Hendricks, Secretary – Deb Lammle, Treasurer – Connie Warsaw, Christian Growth – Annette Warsaw, and Mission Coordinator – Terri Hooker. Happy 100h Birthday!

Happy 100th Birthday Ladies Aid! The Immanuel Lutheran Ladies Aid was organized by Rev. Henry Predoehl in 1921. The first meeting was not held at the church but rather in the brick home on the north side of main street in Osman which was the home of Mr. Charles Adams. There were approximately fifteen women at the first meeting. Augusta Meyer was the first president and Clara Adams was the first secretary. For six years the ladies had their meetings in homes until they bought the old Dunkard Church and had it moved by a steam engine across the fields. After they and their husbands did some mighty remodeling, the building was respectable to hold meetings in. And soon the necessity for a larger kitchen was apparent so an addition was added to the building. This is where they served their chicken suppers, ice cream socials, and threshermen dinners.

So many changes have occurred as the years progressed, but the ladies always engaged in activities and projects that helped people in need. In the winter months the ladies quilted one day a week. They quilted beautiful quilts for many people upon request. They also served farm sales which was an immense effort to make money for their mission projects. In 2020 the Ladies Aid and the LWML combined. The Ladies Aid is the oldest organization in our church today.

On December 12, this milestone will be recognized in the church service. Old pictures have been collected which will appear on the back bulletin board under the balcony. Due to COVID restrictions, there will not be a cake/punch reception in the hall, but a treat bag will be given to each person attending the worship service that day.

Benefit Soup Supper

Thank you to all the members who volunteered in a variety of ways for the benefit soup supper on Saturday, November 13. Approximately 70 community members enjoyed the soups, sandwiches, and desserts that were donated by our church members and community members. It was a new adventure as this was the first "grab your food and go" benefit due to COVID restrictions. This combined contribution of \$5240 will help with Brian's medical expenses as he now needs open heart surgery before Christmas. It was an evening of packing to-go sacks with food as adjustments were made to the new format, but it was a rewarding experience to help someone in need in our community.
