From Pastor McPike's Desk...

Why is it called HOLY week?

The week before Easter has, for many years, been called "Holy Week". But what is holy about it?

Holy week starts on Palm Sunday. Of course, the events of Palm Sunday morning where Jesus rode into the city in a triumphant parade of sorts, being hailed with "Hosannas" and called the "Son of David" and being blessed for coming in the Name of the Lord seemed to be a high point for Jesus. Yet it was that very event that caused the first UNHOLY thing of the week to happen. Jesus' enemies met together later that day and decided that Jesus must die. Determining to kill the Son of God would seem very UNHOLY.

So why is it called HOLY week?

Those same leaders spent the next days trying to make a fool of Jesus. They wanted to discredit Him. First, they questioned His authority to do miracles. Even though He was doing miracles, if they could claim it was power from somewhere other than God, they would discredit Him. He would be seen as unholy. Jesus successfully refuted them by asking them about the authority behind John the Baptist.

So why is it called HOLY week?

They then tried to pit Jesus against the Romans... by asking whether the people should pay taxes to Rome or pay money to God. Jesus once again turned it back on them, by telling them to give to each as was good and right. It was another attempt to trick Jesus. It was unholy.

So why is it called HOLY week?

The next challenge painted a hypothetical picture... where a man married a woman, died, and then his brother fulfilled his obligation to keep the family line by marrying the widow... through several brothers who all died. This was pitting Jesus against a teaching of Moses... whose wife would she be in the resurrection? Attempting to make Jesus look like He disagreed with Moses was unholy.

So why is it called HOLY week?

Not being able to discredit Jesus publicly, the leadership decided to bribe one of Jesus' closest associates, Judas, one of the 12 disciples, to betray Him. Judas accepted the bribe... 30 pieces of silver. Bribery is unholy. Bribery to betray God's son is UNHOLY.

So why is it called HOLY week?

After the most important meal of the year, the Passover Meal on Thursday of that week, Jesus and His disciples went to the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus would often go to pray. Judas, the aforementioned bribed friend of Jesus, betrayed Jesus. Betrayal is unholy. Betraying God's Son is VERY unholy.

So why is it called HOLY week?

Not only was Jesus betrayed by a close friend, but He was abandoned by the rest of his friends. One of them even denied Him. Running from a friend in need, telling lies to save your own skin... very unholy.

So why is it called HOLY week?

The Jewish ruling council wanted to dispatch Jesus quietly. The trial they held was at night. They had to manufacture witnesses to speak against Jesus to condemn Him to death. Playing with justice in this way – an illegal trial at night, stacking witnesses against Him, all unholy.

So why is it called HOLY week?

Even though the council condemned Jesus to death, they were not allowed to put Him to death under Roman law. They had to have the Roman Governor, Pontius Pilate, to do so. Pilate at first was reluctant, knowing that it was wrong for them to do so. Even so, he bowed to public and political pressure and condemned Jesus to death. Going against what is right in the face of pressure is UNHOLY.

So why is it called HOLY week?

The Son of God was whipped; Herod made fun of Him; He was stripped of His clothing, and it was given away. He was hanged on a cross to die between two criminals. UNHOLY!!!!

So why is it called HOLY week?

The week was made holy by the innocent, holy blood of the Son of God that was poured out on the cross for you and for me. Jesus Christ came, He lived, He was subjected to all the un-holiness that this evil world could throw at Him, and He did it willingly for all the unholy times in your life. He did it to pay for your un-holiness, so that you could be forgiven.

Why is it called HOLY week?

Many unholy things happened that last week of Jesus' earthly life before his death and resurrection. It became the focus of all the forces of creation, both good and evil, came together in a cosmic war, where the truth of the first promise of a savior in Genesis 3:15 was realized – the Son of God, descended from Eve, had His heel bruised by Satan; but Satan's head was finally and completely crushed.

It is called Holy Week because our Holy God lived a Holy life for us, UNHOLY people.

It is called Holy Week because our Holy God subjected Himself to the punishment of un-holiness.

It is called Holy Week because our Holy God rose victoriously from the dead and lives and rules in heaven, where He waits for us to join Him.

It is called Holy Week because it resulted, ultimately in a holy, happy ending.

What a privilege we have to gather to worship our great God on a week known for many years in history as "Holy week", right in our own Church, Immanuel Lutheran Church of Osman.

Maundy Thursday worship with Holy Communion is Thursday, April 14th at 7:00 PM.

Good Friday Tenebrae worship will be held Friday, April 15th at 7:00 PM.

Easter Sunday worship with Holy Communion is Sunday, April 17th at 7:00 AM.

Ladies Aid/LWML



Connie Warsaw gave the treasurer's report which showed a balance of \$894.02 after an anonymous \$500 donation was given. Members paid their \$18 dues to the treasurer at the meeting. 


Mowing List
