### From Pastor McPike's Desk....

#### "There is Love... and then... there's God's love"

February is known for several things. People are tired of snow and cold. Spring has not yet sprung, but the days are getting longer, and the sun's heat is doing more to warm our part of the earth than the previous two to three months. In the middle of the month is a day that has been attributed to St. Valentine.

St. Valentine was a priest or bishop who lived in the third century of the church. He ministered to persecuted Christians in the Roman Empire, and was martyred on February 14, 269. Saints who are martyred are often remembered on the day that they were martyred, not the day they were born. Their death day is considered to be their "birthday" into eternity with God. St. Valentine is the patron saint of love, which probably goes without saying.

Greek, the language of the New Testament, has four words that translate to English as "love". *Philia*, (pronounced "Fil-lee-ah") which is love of siblings, which is why "*Phila*delphia" is called the "City of Brotherly love." *Storge* (pronounced "Store-gay") is love family members tend to have for each other... even when they do not necessarily like each other. *Eros* (pronounced "Air-rose") is romantic love, the physical attraction, sexual-involved love (hence the English word, *Erotic*). No further explanation needed!

The chapter in the Bible sometimes referred to as "the Love Chapter" is 1 Corinthians 13. This tends to be a popular chapter for weddings. Take a look at it. It includes the following: "Love is patient, love is kind, it does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud.... It keeps no record of wrongs." This sounds like a great formula for a fantastic marriage, and indeed it is. But I have always cringed a bit when it is included in weddings without explanation.

Why? Why should love as presented in this chapter be explained? Well, remember first that what we have as our Bible is a *translation* from the original languages. In the case of the New Testament, that is ancient Greek. When this passage is read at weddings without explanation, many can

swoon in the "love" that tends to permeate the air with all the various connotations. The Greek word for Love in 1 Corinthians 13 is the fourth Greek word... *Agape*, pronounced "Ah-gahp-ay". This is the love that God has for us.

God's love for us, *agape*, is the kind of love that only God can have. *Agape* love can come only from the perfect, the sinless. God's love gives without looking for how God is going to benefit from giving that love. It is a love that humans do well to strive for, but short of the grave, will never achieve. The word "love" used in Luke 10:27 "Love the Lord your God with all your heart... and your neighbor as yourself" is also the word *Agape* or the "perfect, giving, never looking for return" kind of love.

This, then, explains why I'm not fond of this chapter used in weddings unless it is explained. Love is mentioned numerous times in this chapter – which, understandably, is the topic of the day at weddings! – yet it is not romantic love, it is God's giving love. Now, to the extent that each person employs such love, to the extent that sinful humans can employ it, the marriage will be a wonderful success. This kind of love can truly only come from those who are God's children. As we are God's baptized children, we are called and empowered by the Holy Spirit to live as God would have us live. Loving others as God would love us is central to the Christian life.

Love is not love for love's sake. It is love for God's sake. It is love that comes from God, is powered by God, modeled by God, blessed by God.
